Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

This weekend we celebrate the Feast of the Baptism of the Lord, when we remember that John the Baptist baptized Jesus at the Jordan River.

Now, first of all, this **“baptism”** wasn't the same thing as we call baptism today, which is the sacrament whereby we enter into Christ's Church as He asked the apostles to do in Matthew 28 (go and baptize all nations, He said to them). For at the time of John the Baptist, Jesus had not begun the Church yet.

But the Jewish people had a tradition of turning back to God and signifying a change of heart away from sin through taking a ritual bath, and this is the tradition that John was using in bathing people in the Jordan River as they repented of their sins. It's why he challenges some who are coming for the ritual bath, for he says they really haven't repented, but are just going through the externals of the event, which meant nothing in his eyes.

Jesus also, certainly, didn't need to go through this baptism or repentance, for He had nothing to repent, but, as usual, He was showing us the way (that we all need to repent) just as He showed us the way with the cross (that our lives need to be, ultimately, at the service of the Kingdom of God and given as a gift to God for the sake of spreading the Love of God in our world).

Which brings us to a perfect definition of what it means to be a baptized Christian: One who has undergone the modern Sacrament of Baptism. That is that we too, like Jesus, see our lives as a gift to God....as in the service of building up the Kingdom of God.

DEACON DOUG'S Q & A: Question: How many different liturgical colors are they?

Answer to last week's question about Ordinary time. Ordinary here refers not to "ordinary" as in every day or ordinary dishes, but to the number system – first, second, third, and so forth. Without going into math theory, Ordinal numbers simply indicate the "order" in which events occur or things are counted. There are 33 or 34 Sundays in Ordinary time, depending on the date of Easter.

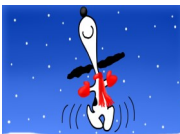

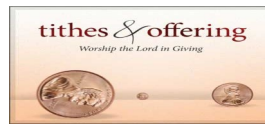

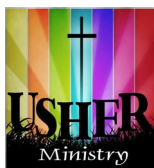


DC MARCH FOR LIFE - FRIDAY, JANUARY 24th:

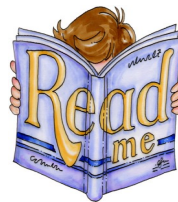

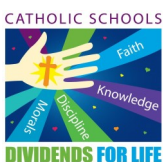

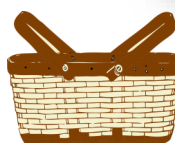
