Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

Today's readings (Second Sunday of Ordinary Time, Year A), remind us of how Jesus came among us to be a light for all nations. We hear about Israel being made a light for the world in Isaiah 49, the first reading today, and then we hear about a voice from heaven giving a sign to all that Jesus was the chosen one, and the Son of God.

We too are called to be lights for all the nations, but it can wear us out at times, so we all need to look for renewal, at times, in our lives. The Psalm today (the 40th Psalm) reminds us of that. A famous song by the music group "U2," called "40" used this Psalm and I sang it to myself many times when I was younger:

*I waited patiently for the Lord, he inclined and heard my cry.
He gathers me up out of the pit, out of the mire and clay,
I will sing a new song. How long to sing this song?
He sets me up upon a rock, and makes my footsteps firm.
Many will see, many will see and fear.
I will sing a new song. How long to sing this song?*

Lets keep praying, practicing our faith and growing in love in our lives so as to be renewed by the Lord....and continue to "sing" His "song" and to be a light to the nations.

DC March for Life on Friday, January 24th - The March for Life in Washington DC is the largest pro-life event in the world that marks the anniversary of Roe v. Wade, which is the 1973 Supreme Court Decision that led to the legalization of abortion. Katherine Miller will be leading the group from Holy Family. We will be departing from Holy Family at 11am (meet in the Narthex at the front of the Church) and taking the metro to the National Mall for the rally followed by the march. Arrival back at Holy Family will be around 4pm. 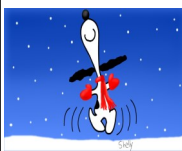

ENVIRONMENTAL MINISTREE: *Did you know* that English Ivy kills trees. Brought over by the colonists to remind them of home in their gardens, it is now found throughout the East Coast. Winter is a great time to identify these invasive vines growing on our trees. Hint, they are green in the winter. In addition to competing for nutrients and water in the soil, Ivy actually extracts them through rootlets right from the **inner bark or "phloem"** which is the pipe line through which food and water are passed to the rest of the tree. Ivy will eventually block the sun from canopy as well. Growing vertically ivy matures, flowers and goes to seed. Eaten by birds the seeds are spread well beyond the place of origin. This time of year, the biggest threat is the sheer weight of the biomass. Winter snow and wind can topple an already weakened tree. The best thing to do now is cut the vines at the base of the tree and clear a circle two feet from the trunk on the ground. Do not pull off the vines, as this can damage the bark. **It can take many months for the ivy to die, but you can save the tree.** Here at Church we have cleared all the ivy from our property, but you can still see it on some of our neighbors trees. 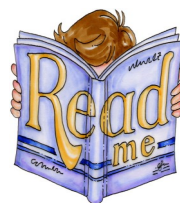

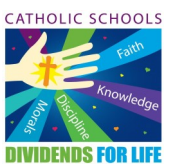

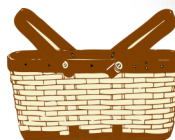
