CARING FOR CREATION:

Tuesday was clean out bluebird box day. Did you know there are six of them here at Holy Family and the seventh at the rectory? It was interesting to see the different material used in the boxes, but this grass was typical. In some cases, nests in the nesting boxes were made from evergreen needles. It is important to clean out these boxes, so any insects that may be there are cleared out and the box is fresh for this new season which begins in early March. If you have a bluebird nesting box, now is the time.

Just starting to see all this brilliant color in the male Bluebirds at the feeders. The females continue their muted feathers, so they are less visible to predators. Boy are they hungry. They eat hulled sunflowers (no shells) and most importantly meal worms or black fly larva (don't worry, they are freeze dried). Please let me know if you need any help in selecting or installing feeders or nesting boxes. These birds are truly a gift from God. Thank you Donna and Bob Levin for the opportunity to install two bluebird nesting boxes and two wren nesting boxes yesterday in their back yard. I'm sure the birds will love it.

Our prayer and presence at Planned Parenthood can change the hearts and minds of women who are considering abortion and abortion workers. We should pray in Church and elsewhere for the end of abortion, but note that Ramona Trevino, a former Planned Parenthood manager and now the national 40 Days for Life Outreach Coordinator, said if vigil standers had not been outside her abortion clinic, she would never have known people were praying for her!
