ADORATION MINISTRY NEWS: Did you know that Holy Family Catholic parish has a Perpetual Eucharistic Adoration ministry? What is Eucharistic Adoration? Eucharistic Adoration is visiting and spending time with Jesus in the Sacred Host. It is an expression of our love for Jesus, who loves us so much that He never wants to leave us and stays with us day and night in the Blessed Sacrament. Perpetual Eucharistic Adoration is when a parish sets aside a small room, in our case the Adoration Oratory, that is open 24 hours a day, 7 days a week, with the permanent exposition of Jesus in the Most Blessed Sacrament, the Holy Eucharist. Please know that you can sign up at www.holyfamilychurch.com and find the “**Adoration**” icon on the home page. Click on that icon to sign up. **Please also know two things:** 1. That you can sign up for once or twice a month to pray at a given time slot **AND** that 2. You can sign up on time slots that are already taken (the more people involved the better). PARISHIONERS 70½ YEARS AND OLDER: Please remember that if you choose to make a charitable distribution from your traditional IRA account, Holy Family is qualified to receive such a distribution under applicable tax law. There are specific tax advantages for those over 70 and ½ years of age who choose to make these types of charitable donations. The donation must be made directly to the qualified charity and Holy Family will acknowledge each charitable donation in writing as required by tax law. **You should of course consult your tax advisor before making a federally tax-free charitable distribution from your IRA.**



STOCK DONATIONS TO HOLY FAMILY: Donating appreciated stock is an efficient way to make a charitable gift. It's easy and it saves the donor from paying capital gains taxes. If you itemize your deductions you are eligible to deduct the full fair market value of the stock, up to IRS limits. With the stock market near all time highs, utilizing appreciated stock for charitable gifting is worth considering. Effectively you're able to contribute 20% more than if you sold the stock and paid capital gains taxes. DEACON DOUG'S Q & A: Question: What are the responsibilities of the "Chancellor" of a diocese?

Answer to last week's question about objects used at Mass: A paten is the metal or wooden plate that holds the Eucharist for Mass; a purificator is the small white linen used to clean the chalice; a corporal is the white linen placed on the altar upon which are placed the chalice, the paten and other liturgical implements for Mass.

LENTEEN REGULATIONS: Abstinence from meat is to be observed by all Catholics 14 years and older on Good Friday and all Fridays during Lent. **Fasting** is to be observed on Good Friday by all Catholics who are 18 years of age but not yet 59. Those who are bound by this may take only one full meal. Two smaller meals are permitted, if necessary, to maintain strength according to one's needs, but eating solid foods between meals is not permitted. Catholics should not lightly excuse themselves from these prescribed minimal penitential practices.

A quick search found lots of places to drop off the empty shells. They end up over in Cambridge, Maryland where the shells age in the sun for a year. 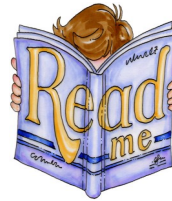

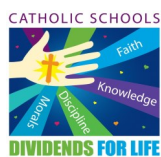
