HOLY FAMILY

Dear Friends,

As we continue Lent just a simple thought that Pope Francis shared on Ash Wednesday, 2021 (Feb. 17). He simply asked, **"Is our life centered on GOD or on OURSELVES?"** That is the crux of our challenge this Lent...is our life about finding God in our spiritual lives or seeing God in others and responding to others out of love, or is our life too much about ourselves?

Of course, we are always called to take care of ourselves and to set limits. Indeed, I remember back in 1993 or so I was volunteering at a hospice at nighttime run by the Mother Teresa sisters, the Missionaries of Charities, very selfless people. I remember how the City of Baltimore called them once to see if they could increase the number of people they accommodated: They treated those who had no where else to go and no money, and there were more people that needed their kind of service.

Guess what? They said no. That they couldn't take on more patients without jeopardizing the sisters and their need for rest. Funny, even the Mother Teresa nuns set limits.

Also, those reading the challenging words from our Pope today might have just finished doing overtime for their job or jobs, or have been dealing with an illness or an argument in their house. So, I know it can be difficult to sometimes think about centering our life more on God and on being people for others. Let's pray about how God might be calling us, in a healthy way, to center our lives more on God and not so much on ourselves.

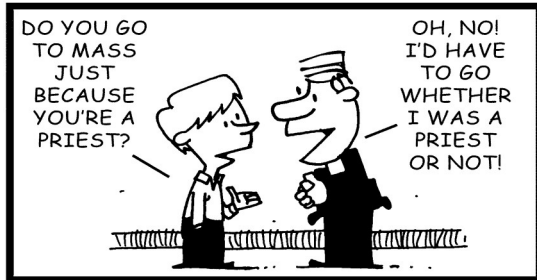
