I thank all the staff members and parishioners who helped make the Parish Mission, the Pot-luck Dinners on Monday and Tuesday nights, and the nightly childcare a reality. I especially thank Margaret Wood, our Director of Adult Enrichment, for all of her planning beforehand and her good work during the Mission.

Deacon Doug's Q&A

QUESTION: At the Chrism Mass on the Monday before Easter, the Archbishop blesses three oils used by the Church throughout the year. What are they?

Answer to the question can we receive communion more than once a day: The answer is yes, although guidelines of Canon Law 917 need to be followed. A person may receive Holy Communion a second time, provided he does so during a celebration of the Eucharist in which he participates. For example, one may receive Communion at a daily Mass, and again at a wedding, funeral, or other ritual.

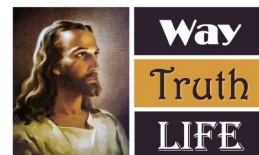
Anointing of the Sick: If you or someone you know would like to receive this sacrament please contact the office, or if appropriate, the hospital chaplain.
