~ *Pastor's Note* ~

Gathering on this Palm Sunday, we begin Holy Week, the holiest week of the Church year. I invite you to participate in the services of The Sacred Triduum - the Mass of the Lord's Supper on Holy Thursday at 7:30pm in the Church; The Solemn Commemoration of the Lord's Passion and Death on Good Friday at 2pm; and the Easter Vigil Mass on Holy Saturday Night beginning at 8pm.

The full schedule of Holy Week, the day and times for the Sacrament of Reconciliation and other events can be found in this bulletin, in the Friday Blast, and on our website (www.holyfamilychurch.com).

This Monday evening, April 11th, of Holy Week, Deacon Doug Lovejoy and I will join with fellow clergy and Catholics from throughout the Archdiocese for the Chrism Mass celebrated by Archbishop Lori at The Cathedral of Mary Our Queen in Baltimore. At this Mass, the Archbishop will bless the three Oils - the Oil of Catechumens, the Oil of the Sick and the Oil of Sacred Chrism. Candidates for the Sacrament of Baptism are anointed with the Oil of the Catechumens to strengthen them as they prepare to be Baptized. Any person who is seriously ill or who is anticipating a surgery or a medical procedure can ask to be anointed for healing with the Oil of the Sick. When a person is Baptized, Confirmed or Ordained a Priest, the person is anointed with the Oil of Chrism to strengthen them in living out the sacrament which they have received.

Our Parish will formerly receive the Oils at the beginning of the Mass of The Lord's Supper on Holy Thursday, April 14th.


All Churches look to the Christmas and Easter offertory collections to provide funds to support the mission of the Parish. Effectively you're able to contribute 20% more than if you sold the stock and paid capital gains taxes. PARISHIONERS 70½ YEARS AND OLDER: Please remember that if you choose to make a charitable distribution from your traditional IRA account, Holy Family is qualified to receive such a distribution under applicable tax law. There are specific tax advantages for those over 70 and ½ years of age who choose to make these types of charitable donations. The donation must be made directly to the qualified charity and Holy Family will acknowledge each charitable donation in writing as required by tax law. **You should of course consult your tax advisor before making a federally tax-free charitable distribution from your IRA.**

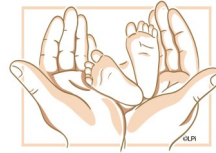

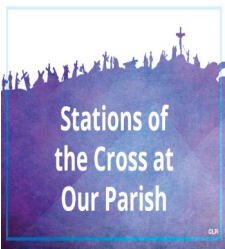
DEACON DOUG'S Q & A: Why is the Easter Vigil so special?

Answer to the question about the latest date for Easter: This year is not quite the latest. That date is April 25th and the earliest is March 22nd. According to Scripture, Jesus rose from the dead on the first Sunday following the feast of Passover the date of which depended on the Jewish calendar which was not easily determined by their use of a lunar calendar. Christian churches therefore at the Council of Nicea in 325 AD created a formula for the date for the Easter celebration to be on the first Sunday after the first full moon, following the Spring Equinox but always after Jewish Passover. Orthodox Churches follow the same formula but based on their continued use of the Julian calendar rather than the Gregorian calendar we use in the West. Orthodox Easter this year is celebrated on April 24th.



40 DAYS FOR LIFE SPRING CAMPAIGN: Began March 2nd and runs through this Sunday, April 10th (Palm Sunday). Please join Holy Family and be a Voice for the Vulnerable pre-born babies and their mothers, by praying and fasting to

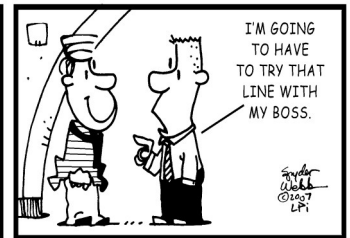
