~ Pastor's Note ~

Several months ago parishioners along with Our Lady of Perpetual Help (OLPH) and Our Lady of Sorrows (OLOS) started collecting monies to help build a new rectory at our Sister Parish of St. Elizabeth of Hungary in Perodin, Haiti. The 1940's Era rectory was destroyed by an earthquake in December of 2021. The former rectory served not only as a home for the Pastor and the deacon but also as a Parish Office and as a meeting space for parishioners. Since the earthquake the Pastor, Fr. Gilfrid and the deacon have been living in a classroom in a school which was recently built and suffered no damage from the earthquake.

I share with you an update of our progress on the Rectory Project. So far, Holy Family parishioners have contributed just under \$25,000 towards our goal of \$60,000 to start construction of the new rectory. Like myself, some parishioners are making monthly payments toward their unwritten pledge of making a \$500 contribution. I thank all the parishioners who have made a contribution for this worthy project.

Soon, I will receive information on the amount of monies collected by parishioners at OLPH and OLOS, who are also members along with us with our Sister Parish of St. Elizabeth of Hungary.

PARISHIONERS 72 YEARS AND OLDER: Parishioners required to take distributions from their IRA accounts can gift directly to Holy Family. CARING FOR CREATION: All Spring long they came and went. Sometimes several at a time. The blues got bluer, the excitement grew. Male bluebirds dive and swirl as they show off to the still muted Females. With the few shoulder patches of blue I could tell who is who, as the ladies feasted on the mealworms. After a while I was suddenly filling the feeder twice, then three times a day. They were gobbling food as fast as they could. I don't remember ever seeing this much food being eaten by the bluebirds. So, one evening I'm on a Franciscan Zoom Prayer call. Glancing up, a Female lands on a hook on the deck outside my window and starts hollering. Two fledglings arrive, one to a side. Mom goes into the feeder grabs some mealworms and feeds each of the open mouthed fledglings. Then with a wink in her eye, they are gone. I can only think that she was showing me last time, what she had been so busy about feeding these two babies that were as big as she was. I was God smacked. I have not seen them since.
