HOLY FAMILY

Dear Friends,

This weekend we remember **FATHER'S DAY**. On this day we remember the goodness of having the example and support of Dads or of fellows who were like a Dad to us.

In my own life, my Dad gave me a good example in that I saw that his priority was to help the family: He owned very little, just a pipe rack and two albums, one a Polka album the other a Bluegrass album, he got his Washington Post every day, but that was about it. He just gave everything else to the family.

On top of that, while he was a man of his era, and not inclined to sharing much about what he was feeling on the inside, he also was a lot of fun, and had a way with a joke, would sing songs as we drove to make us laugh....and so he taught me to have fun in life. We remained close until he died when I was 20 years old.

But, his death at an early age reminded me back then how much I needed a father figure or mentor after he passed. At that time maybe first my faith in God helped me because I started relying more on my **HEAVENLY** Father and the knowledge that I had a Savior in Jesus and was accompanied by the prayers of the saints and the grace of God always. Also back then I looked for good examples among older fellows. I knew then who sort of became mentors for me. A youth minister, campus minister, etc. They were literally a Godsend for me in the midst of my challenges during my young adulthood.

All of this leads me to simply say that our young people today **NEED GOOD DADS OR MENTORS FROM AMONG OUR GUYS** and our young people today need our **GOOD EXAMPLE**. We need guys who want to serve as coaches, mentors and youth ministers who are good examples and who are grounded in their faith and in helping others and who **ALSO** are happy and joyful guys.

For today more than ever, I believe, our young people need to see that you won't be happy if you are a man because you are promiscuous, drink a lot, party a lot, curse a lot or make a lot of money: No, our young people need to see Dads and mentors who have found their peace of mind and a meaning in life and joy through faith and helping others and also a healthy sense of fun.

Here's to all the guys who do that on this day!

STOCK DONATIONS TO HOLY FAMILY: Donating appreciated stock is an efficient way to make a charitable gift. It's easy and it saves the donor from paying capital gains taxes. If you itemize your deductions you are eligible to deduct the full fair market value of the stock, up to IRS limits. With the stock market near all time highs, utilizing appreciated stock for charitable gifting is worth considering. Effectively you're able to contribute 20% more than if you sold the stock and paid capital gains taxes. DEACON DOUG'S Q & A: Question: Next to the tabernacle in the sanctuary of the church is a red glass container with a lit candle inside? What is it? Why is it there?

Answer to last week's question about hymns sung during the Corpus Christi procession: Traditionally these are: Panis Angelicus ("Bread of Angels"), Adore Te Devote ("Humbly I Adore Thee"), O Salutaris hostia ("O Saving Victim"), and Pange Lingua ("Now, My Tongue, the Mystery Telling"). Tantum Ergo ("Therefore So Great"), sung at the Benediction that normally follows, is the last two verses of Pange Lingua. These songs are attributed to St. Thomas Aquinas.

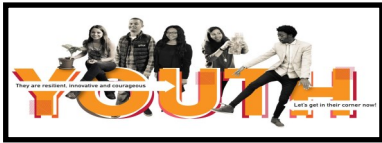

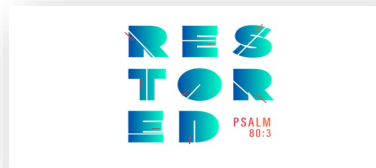
