HOLY FAMILY

Dear Brothers & Sisters,

Please remember that we are having our Blessing of the Animals in honor of the Feast of St. Francis at 1pm out back on Sunday, Oct. 4. We will do things a little differently, though, this year. All participants – human and animal (!) staying in their cars during the whole service. So, before 1pm just park your car out back and wait. Myself and others will say some prayers and we'll sing the **PRAYER OF ST. FRANCIS** from the balcony (miked) and then you will line up and folks will drive by to receive individual blessings and receive Covid-safe "curbside" deliveries of St. Francis medals, dog and cat treats, holy cards, etc. We'll do everything safe and with rubber gloves, masks **AND A LOT OF LOVE**. See you there.

There are so many things happening in the world, so we wanted to invite you to do some special prayers during the month of October to lift up our nation and our world in prayer.

I am thinking of so many issues that we can think of during the month of October and how we want to ask the Lord Jesus and all the saints to help us to be agents of change and love in this time. **Here is how:**

- ◆ **The first thing we will be doing is very simple. We will be saying a "Hail Mary" after every Mass Oct. 1-31.** Right after the final blessing and before the St. Michael Prayer at Daily Mass.
- ◆ **The second thing is that we will be saying the rosary, as a parish on the weekends of Saturday, Oct. 10-11 & Oct. 17-18** before the 5pm Mass in the Church (4:30pm) and before the outdoor 11:15am Mass (10:45am.) So, at 4:30pm on Oct. 10 and 17 and at 10:45am on Oct. 11 and 18. **Please note that EVERY WEEK OF THE YEAR we pray the rosary at 6:30pm on Mondays in the Chapel and 4:30pm on Saturdays in the Church.**
- ◆ **Parishioners will be invited to also participate in a NOVENA between Saturday, Oct. 10 and Sunday, Oct. 18.** Each day we will be saying the following novena prayer.

Novena Prayer to the Sacred Heart of Jesus and the Immaculate Heart of Mary:

O Sacred Heart of Jesus and Immaculate Heart of Mary, to your Holy Hearts do I come to ask for your assistance and the graces that only God can give. Jesus, Your Sacred Heart is burning with love for me. I know that you love all of us so much. Mary, your Immaculate Heart, loves each one of us as a child. With your Immaculate Heart, O Mary, and with Your Sacred Heart, Lord Jesus, I offer your love with this prayer to our Heavenly Father, and through your Holy Hearts humbly request... (Daily intention – see below)

Most Sacred Heart of Jesus and Immaculate Heart of Mary, I shall never be able to thank you enough for loving me so much. I offer my love in return and pray I can serve you and build up the Church and serve God's people through my life. Amen.

Our Father, Hail Mary, Glory be and St. Michael's Prayer.

Day 1: We pray for our Church, that Catholics be agents of the Kingdom of God. **Day 2:** We pray for Pope Francis, Archbishop Lori and all who lead our Church. **Day 3:** We pray for our parish, that we be motivated to bring the love of Christ to all we do. **Day 4:** We pray for our world and for all the nations especially where there is suffering. **Day 5:** We pray for our nation. **Day 6:** We pray for peace and reconciliation in our country. **Day 7:** We pray for a fair election in November and for civil and honest discourse in our nation. **Day 8:** We pray for protection of life in our country at all its stages. **Day 9:** We pray for a mindfulness of the struggles of the poor and the oppressed and those who face injustice.

CARING FOR CREATION MINISTRY:

Did you know the 17 year brood of cicadas is coming next year? Don't worry you won't miss hearing or seeing them. I have seen a few so far from other brood cycles in the last month or so. We do get some of them every year. Next year should be a sight to behold. We are talking Biblical Terms here in places with hundreds on individual trees, on sidewalks, cars and well frankly everywhere. Dogs love them as snacks. If your dog or other pet eats too many they will have issues you will have to deal with. They will not harm your pet but too much protein can be a problem. So, this particular brood has been waiting for 17 years to emerge from the ground. They have one mission, to mate and lay eggs, mostly on our flowering dogwoods, redbud trees and other smaller trees. The females fly recklessly about and crawl out to the outer branches. When she reaches the pencil sized branches, she slits the bark along a several inch path and lays her eggs. Later the eggs hatch and fall to the ground where the nymphs bury themselves, to feed upon root structures until it is time to start all over. In the news next spring there will be lots of information on what to do and most importantly not to do, which is spray insecticides which kill most everything including our bees and butterflies. I have two neighbors that spray regularly for mosquitoes, which is sad and rarely see them outside anyway. Oh well, we can only control ourselves and even that can be a challenge for me. **God bless you all.** Questions? Email Chris Gordon, OFS at christophergordon@verizon.net

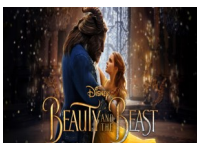
