*Dear Brothers & Sisters,*

This weekend we continue preparing for Advent, where we get ready for the celebration of Christmas and the birth of Christ with hearts and souls renewed. As part of that celebration you can click on the ADVENT MAILING icon OR the ADVENT 2020 icon on the home page of [www.holyfamilychurch.com](http://www.holyfamilychurch.com) for thoughts of things to do.

**ALSO this weekend a few things to remember:**

- 1. Be a light this Advent Season. Help us “make a bed for Baby Jesus” like the straws of Bethlehem** so many years ago. Mangers where you can place your good deeds written on yellow slips of paper will be in the JMJ Café, as you enter **UNITY HALL** for Mass and also in the Narthex, as you enter the **CHURCH** for Mass.
- 2. We'll be posting, in the flocknote and on the Facebook page, one to three minute long videos about faith and the Advent/Christmas season** many days between the first day of Advent (Nov. 29th) and Christmas Day. Some videos will be by myself, Deacon Doug, Deacon Moise, staff members or parishioners. This is just a way to try to make Advent more personal for everyone this year in a less personal environment.
- 3. Visit with Santa and his Friends:** This Sunday, December 13th from 1-4pm. Due to the COVID19 Pandemic the traditional Breakfast with Santa has been morphed in a fun holiday drive through the Church parking lot. Families can see elves taking part in their different activities at the North Pole, penguins playing sports (they take after Fr. Andy), get a chance to see Santa and take a COVID safe picture with him, as well as receive a prepackaged special cocoa mix still top secret at the Hot Cocoa Lab in the North Pole. The event in total will take hopefully 5-10 minutes for each vehicle to complete. Due to the generosity of all at the North Pole, this event will be **FREE**. We invite everyone of every age to do the drive-through!
- 4. Please mark your calendars for our penance services. We will have TWO nights this year instead of one to spread people out.** We will have priests far apart from one another in the Church. All will be asked to wear a mask and to keep a distance from the priests and one another.

**STOCK DONATIONS TO HOLY FAMILY:** Donating appreciated stock is an efficient way to make a charitable gift. It's easy and it saves the donor from paying capital gains taxes. If you itemize your deductions you are eligible to deduct the full fair market value of the stock, up to IRS limits. With the stock market near all time highs, utilizing appreciated stock for charitable gifting is worth considering. Effectively you're able to contribute 20% more than if you sold the stock and paid capital gains taxes. **PARISHIONERS 70½ YEARS AND OLDER:** Please remember that if you choose to make a charitable distribution from your traditional IRA account, Holy Family is qualified to receive such a distribution under applicable tax law. There are specific tax advantages for those over 70 and ½ years of age who choose to make these types of charitable donations. The donation must be made directly to the qualified charity and Holy Family will acknowledge each charitable donation in writing as required by tax law. **You should of course consult your tax advisor before making a federally tax-free charitable distribution from your IRA.**



**CARING FOR CREATION:** *Did you know* the best time to plant a tree is 10 years ago and the second best time is right now? Fall is the perfect time of year to plant trees! That's right, trees develop root systems all winter long, They don't need watering like in the spring and when spring arrives the tree is ready to welcome the warming sun with its new leaves. Another thing worth noting, in your garden centers trees are generally **half off** or more. Don't be afraid to ask for a discount. They don't want to pack them up or store them over the winter. Dig the hole twice as large as the root ball and plant the top of the ball slightly above the surrounding soil. Pull the root ends loose so they are ready to plunge into their new Mother Earth's home. Need I say, "**Plant Native**" to feed our native wildlife. If you are purchasing a live balled tree, water it regularly and keep in a sheltered place to minimize its time indoors as much as possible. Hint: dig your hole twice the size of the ball now, in case the ground freezes when its time to plant outdoors.

**WINTER IS COMING** and it is a great time to create a emergency kit for your car. Some things to include are: a first aid kit, snow shovel, jacket and poncho, blanket, ice scraper, gloves, hat, coat and pull over rubber boots. Be sure to top off your windshield wiper fluid with a winter mix. Water and snacks are always a good idea. Jumper cables could save you or someone else in an emergency. Carefully read the instructions on the proper way to connect them or look the instructions up on the web. There are many plastic tubs in different sizes at the stores to organize your emergency kit and keep everything nice and dry. Be safe out there! 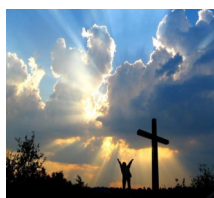
