~ Pastor's Note ~

The beginning of this New Year of 2023 is a good time to look at our spiritual life and so I offer you a few suggestions. In regards to your spiritual health, make it a priority to pray daily and not just on Sundays. Designate a time of the day to pray. Are you a morning person or a night owl? Find a place to pray. There are many ways to pray. Listen to a daily Catholic podcast (Word on Fire by Bishop Barron and Mass Today by Fr. Mike Schmitz) or spiritual music, pray the rosary, pray the breviary which is also called the Book of Christian Prayer which offers us different times of the day to pray, like morning or evening prayer. Open your bible and read a short passage. Since we are reading from the Gospel of Matthew in this Year A, I suggest reading from the Gospel. Place yourself in the Gospel scene. If Jesus is speaking in the gospel passage, picture Jesus speaking personally to you. In regards to how long to pray, I suggest starting out by praying short periods of time. Remember, a runner who is hoping to run a 26 mile marathon, does not start out on day one running 15 miles but increases his/her distance over time. Another way to pray is to quiet yourself down and rest silently in God's presence at home, in our Oratory, our Chapel, which is open during the day. Many saints experienced their minds wandering during prayer. If you find your mind wandering, know that this is not unusual. Gently, bring your attention back to God. If a situation keeps coming back into mind, such as an argument you had with someone yesterday, take that situation or relationship to prayer and ask for the Holy Spirit's guidance.

Traditionally, our Parish Feast Day is The Feast of the Holy Family which is normally celebrated on the Sunday between Christmas Day and January 1st. However, with Christmas being on a Sunday this year, the Feast of the Holy Family will be celebrated on Friday, December 30th. If you are off work during the Christmas week and are in town, I invite you to gather for Mass with us this coming Friday, at 9am for our Parish Feast Day Mass.

The Polar Bear Plunge is coming in a little more than a month's time. On Saturday, February 4, 2023, from 11am-4pm, Marylanders take the *"plunge"* into the waters of the Chesapeake Bay at Sandy Point State Park to raise money for the Maryland Special Olympics. The monies raised will allow our fellow Marylanders to participate in their respective Olympic sports.

I have never participated in this event, never really even thought of participating but this coming year I am going to participate in the 2023 Polar Bear Plunge. I invite you my fellow parishioners to join me in this annual charity event. I especially challenge the men of our parish, including our teenagers, to join our Holy Family team, "The Holy Dippers."

Answer to question about the "Octave of Christmas": From Christmas Day until January 1st, the Solemnity of the Blessed Virgin Mary, the Mother of God, is the Octave Day of

Christmas. The Liturgy gives the clues that every day within the octave is treated the same as the original feast day of the Nativity of our Lord. Other Octaves are celebrated for Easter and Pentecost. The eight day celebration is thought to have come from the Old Testament. E.g., circumcision was performed on the eighth day after as son's birth.
