# GOSPEL MEDITATION - ENCOURAGE DEEPER UNDERSTANDING OF SCRIPTURE

The Epiphany of the Lord January 5, 2020

We may walk many roads when we search for God, and He leads us all the while. The men we honor today were not Jews. The Messiah wasn't coming for *them*, not in the minds of Jesus' contemporaries. These men were astrologers. They were adept at reading portents in the sky, a practice condemned in the Mosaic covenant. Still, to the best of their knowledge and awareness, they were seeking the truth. This truth led them to journey from their own homeland to honor a king they'd never met, one they couldn't be sure truly existed. "We saw his star at its rising and have come to do him homage." Who do you know seeks God so tenaciously?

"Magi from the east arrived in Jerusalem," the Gospel tells us. Who are the seekers in your own life? Maybe it's your cautiously curious co-worker, the neighbor who unexpectedly found peace on a yoga retreat, or your desperately angry child who has chosen, for now, to go their own way. Perhaps they're not overtly headed for Jesus now, not yet. But they may well be seekers of truth in ways we didn't expect. Our invitation is to listen, inquire, and give directions when appropriate.

The magi and modern-day seekers can inspire us as well. When is the last time you sought God's truth so tenaciously? As believers, it can perhaps be easy to become desensitized to the Christmas season and to the miraculous reality we recently celebrated. Mass may have been lovely, but so was the succulent roast beef, the crisp smell of evergreen, and the warm glow of family. Consider asking yourself, "God, do I know you as well as I should? Would I journey as far as the magi to meet You, if I could? Do I journey to meet You daily in prayer? What do those answers say about me, and about our relationship?" Perhaps we, like the magi, can once again be "overjoyed" at seeing the Light of the World.

**DRIVEWAY FUND:** Please remember that the second collection at Mass, *the* second Sunday of every month *(January 11th & 12th)*, will go to our driveway fund. We are hoping to raise funds over the next 15-18 months so as to have a substantial

portion of the costs of that driveway, in addition to creating a ball field and putting up a sign on the land at the corner of Davidsonville Road and Central Avenue that Holy Family now owns. It will help our parish traffic situation to a certain degree and will make our campus safer in case of an emergency. It is also in sync with our long-term campus plan. *Thank you for considering support for this project.*

a letter. We are grateful to all parishioners who donate their time, talent, and treasure to strengthen our spiritual and community life at Holy Family.

**FAITH DIRECT DONATIONS**: If you are making donations through Faith Direct, please remember that if there are any changes to your credit card account (expiration date, new account number) you need to notify Faith Direct. If you do not do this, your donation cannot be processed. The same is true for any changes to your bank accounts if you are paying through ACH. **STOCK DONATIONS TO HOLY FAMILY:** Donating appreciated stock is an efficient way to make a charitable gift. It's easy and it saves the donor from paying capital gains taxes. If you itemize your deductions you are

eligible to deduct the full fair market value of the stock, up to IRS limits.

**ENVIRONMENTAL MINISTREE: Did you** know on average we generate nearly 4 to 5 pounds of trash per person every day? Did you also know a a landfill is not the same thing as a dump? A landfill isolates waste from the environment until it is safe, we

hope. Landfills must meet the criteria for the separation of waste and ground water and for the long-term management and restoration of the site. Any waste site that does not meet these criteria is a dump. Dumps were everywhere in the U.S. through most of the 20th century. The Solid Waste Disposal Act of 1965 created a federal office to manage trash, and by the mid-1970s, states had established waste management regulations. Today the Resource and Recovery Act (RCRA) creates the framework for the proper management of all types of solid waste and stringent design, requirements for modern operation, and closure landfills. Thanks to all who helped to make Winter Relief Week a success. We averaged about 27 guests per night, served healthy and delicious breakfasts and dinners and young volunteers prepared sandwiches for bag lunches for every

day but Sunday (when lunch was served in Unity Hall as most guests stayed with us on that day). Religious education students brought in generous donations, allowing our volunteers to help guests with two days of laundry and providing funds to launder sheets, towels and blankets during and after the week of Winter Relief. Guests and volunteers shared good times during evening activities, including karaoke, bingo and corn hole. Guests were also able to enjoy showers 6 of the 7 days. Volunteers provided transportation for guests whose employment made it impossible to catch the bus that Holy Family rented for transporting most guests to and from Holy Family. Overall, more than 200 volunteers committed time to this year's Winter Relief effort, with many serving on multiple days-some every day. Approximately 1275 volunteer hours were devoted to preparing for and providing services for our guests. That figure does not include all the hours spent by volunteers shopping for groceries and collecting coins for laundering clothes and other supplies. Thank you all for your financial support and prayers and thanks to Father Andy and the parish staff who were supportive of this effort. Please know that our guests were very appreciative of our parish's efforts to help them. One of the guests wrote us a very nice thank-you note in which he said: "I am deeply thankful for all the hard work, time and friendliness all of you have shown me during this week. The meals were excellent. The hospitality was magnificent. May God bless each and all."
