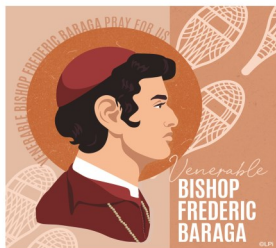

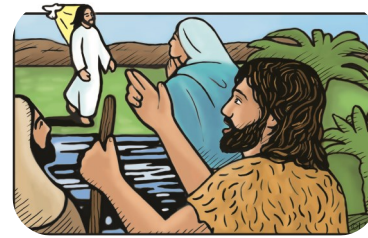
~ *Pastor's Note* ~

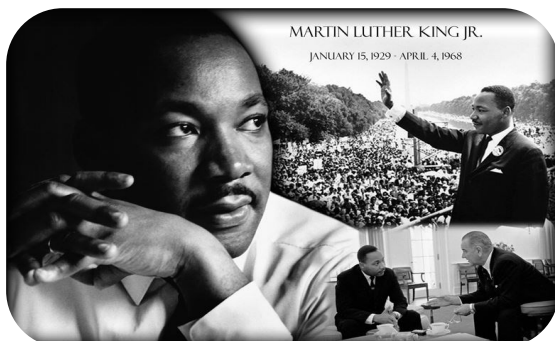

CARING FOR CREATION : Sadly, we had to take down a juniper tree here at Holy Family last fall and I was blessed to be able to make a couple bowls (one pictured below) from the wood. Look forward to showing you this and other bowls at an upcoming Coffee & Donut Sunday.

One version of Juniper is called the White Broom shrub and is abundant in the Palestinian desert regions, growing on hills, in rocky places, ravines, and sandy situations. It is common around the Dead Sea, in Gilead, in the Jordan valley, on the Syrian desert, in Lebanon, on Mount Carmel, and on all the deserts southward to Arabia Petræa, Sinai, and Egypt. It is also said to be found on the Philistine and Phoenician coasts. In the "wilderness" (deserts) it is in many places the only bush that affords any shade. The strength of the juniper tree is seen in its capacity to survive in harsh and bare climates, growing out of rocks and surviving in areas with very little water.

The wisdom of junipers is seen in its ability to live in almost every continent in the world and is one of the oldest living species of trees. The oldest living juniper in the U.S., the Bennett Juniper is thought to be 6000 years old. Junipers have the capacity to self-prune, shedding branches for survival, and its sap is rot resistant.

Juniper berries and sap have been used medicinally in Chinese and Native American cultures and the berries supply food and shelter for native animals. Early pioneers and cowboys have used juniper trees from building to using its soft bark to make bedding and even toilet paper. Please consider native trees wherever you can in the landscape and consider one of the many varieties of Juniper. Check the label, use your phone, make sure it's native and will support our wildlife.
