STOCK DONATIONS TO HOLY FAMILY:

Donating appreciated stock is an efficient way to make a charitable gift. It's easy and it saves the donor from paying capital

gains taxes. If you itemize your deductions you are eligible to deduct the full fair market value of the stock, up to IRS limits. With the stock market near all time highs, utilizing appreciated stock for charitable gifting is worth considering. Effectively you're able to contribute 20% more than if you sold the stock and paid capital gains taxes. PARISHIONERS 70½ YEARS AND OLDER: Please remember that if you choose to make a charitable distribution from your traditional IRA account, Holy Family is qualified to receive such a distribution under applicable tax law. There are specific tax advantages for those over 70 and ½ years of age who choose to make these types of charitable donations. The donation must be made directly to the qualified charity and Holy Family will acknowledge each charitable donation in writing as required by tax law. You should of course consult your tax advisor before making a federally tax-free charitable distribution from your IRA.



CARING FOR CREATION: Rain Barrel Musings. If you don't have one, skip right by this. So, it is about that time of the year to winterize your rain barrels. This is a very easy process if you have the plastic ones, from Arlington Echo or wooden barrels. The main thing is we do not want the barrels to be full of water and then freeze. Water expands when frozen and they could burst. So, the first thing

that needs to be done is disconnect any soaker hose. You can leave it in place right in the garden. What happens is the hose freezes first, then the water cannot get out of the barrel. Be sure the valve(s) are wide open. I place a couple of bricks under the faucet to act as a splash block. Don't worry about the last couple of inches of water in the bottom of the barrel. It can freeze with no ill effects. An overnight freeze with warming daytime temperatures is also fine. It takes a couple of days of sub 32 degree weather to freeze a barrel. I like to get the maximum use out of my 3 barrels and wait to do this final phase, for the last minute, by keeping an eye out on the extended forecast. Certainly here in Maryland, January and February often brings a week or more of below freezing temperatures. Melting snow can fill up your barrels during the day and freeze hard overnight. This could spell trouble. So, now might be the time to get it done and forget about them till March, especially if you go away on vacation. I'll try to send a Spring reminder to get them going again.


