Options for giving include Offertory, Second Collection and special collections, such as Easter. Those of you who are already enrolled in Faith Direct can also use these links to increase your recurring donations if you believe that you are able to do this. Other options for supporting your parish include setting up your offertory donation through your personal online banking bill pay function. CARING FOR CREATION: *Did you know* that English Ivy kills trees. Brought over by the colonists to remind them of home in their gardens, it is now found throughout the East Coast. Winter is a great time to identify these invasive vines growing on our trees. Hint, they are green in the

winter. In addition to competing for nutrients and water in the soil, Ivy actually extracts them through rootlets right from the **inner bark or "phoem"** which is the pipe line through which food and water are passed to the rest of the tree. Ivy will eventually block the sun from canopy as well. Growing vertically ivy matures, flowers and goes to seed. Eaten by birds the seeds are spread well beyond the place of origin. This time of year, the biggest threat is the sheer weight of the biomass. Winter snow and wind can topple an already weakened tree. The best thing to do now is cut the vines at the base of the tree and clear a circle two feet from the trunk on the ground. Do not pull off the vines, as this can damage the bark. It can takes many months for the ivy to die, but **you can save the tree.** Here at church we have cleared all the ivy from our property, but you can still see it on some of our neighbors trees.

Finally, the Pantry is looking for pre-packaged and sealed "only" sandwich meat and cheeses (not fresh cut from the deli) for children's lunches, small jars of condiments, bags of snacks and fruit bars. The meat and cheese items must be delivered during business hours so that we can ensure the donations stay refrigerated. If possible call the Parish Office to let us know you left these in the carts outside. Donations to the poor box go directly to the needy in South County. Thank you for all you do and of course for everything that get donated every week.

MAKING MUSIC PRAYING TWICE:


For the past five years we have been holding preschool musical classes at Holy Family. It has been very successful. With the change in our

Answer to question about Cardinals in the Church: Cardinals traditionally have been known as a Prince of the Church and are chosen by the Pope. Three principal duties are: to elect the pope, serve as his principal counselors, and aid Church throughout the world as bishops of major dioceses, and papal envoys. Only bishops and priests can be Cardinals. If a priest is selected, he will be ordained a bishop first. Currently there are 228 Cardinals. Only those under 80, currently 120, are eligible to select a pope.


