Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

This Sunday we celebrate a Feast Day that we only have on a Sunday once every seven years: The Feast of the Presentation of the Lord, which is always celebrated on February 2nd. On this day, which is forty days since Christmas (can you believe it?) we remember how Jesus was brought to the Temple in Jerusalem by Mary and Joseph as was a tradition for first-born sons.

Because this feast highlights a stage in the life of our Lord and Savior, who is the Light of the world, this feast also came to be associated with the Blessing of Candles – which are, of course, sources of light.

Until 1962, this feast was often referred to, because of the blessing of candles on this day, as "Candlemas" and was considered to be the last day of the Christmas Season.

Indeed, many Catholics, still today, keep their Christmas Nativity set out until this date (including yours truly).

You are invited to a **TEACHING MASS** in the Chapel on February 4th at 7pm where we will **GO THROUGH THE ENTIRE MASS** explaining and discussing it. We'll give you a hand-out with a lot of information explaining the Mass and the history of the Mass.

Also, all parishioners are invited to a parish-wide discussion of the book "Letter to a Suffering Church" by Bishop Robert Barron on Tuesday, February 11th at 7pm in classrooms 12-13. This book is about the issue of abuse in the Church and how to address it.

ENVIRONMENTAL MINISTREE: Did you know that the Department of Public Works did a presentation at the Smithsonian Environmental Research Center on January 22nd? Over 100 citizens showed up in the cold and dark. I know a few things about recycling and taking care of the

environment but found there are still things to be learned. As a reminder if you put your recycles in a plastic bag, it will get pulled out of the recycle stream and sent to the landfill. It is too big a liability to their employees to open any bag. Most likely it will be sent, along with the wish cycling material, to King George VA, at a cost of \$45 a ton, plus shipping. There was a Q&A session about what could be recycled. Here are some things that cannot be recycled: Because of the dust, mulch bags, wood pellet and pet food bags are unacceptable. The dust will contaminate the recycle stream. Single use plastic utensils, any window panes, mirrors, ceramics any paper products soiled with food are not acceptable. Finally snack packaging and cereal bags, if they crinkle when you squeeze them, they are trash. For more information go to https://www.aacounty.org/ and search recycle.
