February 4th & 5th

The eleven members of our Parish's Strategic Planning Committee met for the first time on Tuesday, January 24th. The strategic planning formation will take 12 to 15 months to complete. Becki Kaman and Wayne Hipley, staff of the Archdiocese, are leading us in formulating our Strategic Plan.

The purpose of the committee is to examine all aspects of our parish's life such as worship; prayer; evangelization; faith formation for all ages; youth ministry; service and witness; facilities and parking; communication and community relations.

At the first meeting the members of the committee shared their impressions about our parish's life. Some members commented that our parish has many ministries and activities but one member raised a good question, "Do the various ministries and activities share and operate from a common vision which unifies our parish?" Not many members, including myself, could state the mission statement of our parish. Our parish's mission statement can be found on the front of our bulletin (***Engaged in Christ, Engaged with Each Other, Engaged in Our Community***).

Hopefully, by the time you read this in print, I will have met on Friday, February 3rd, with Becki Kaman to plan our next step. I will keep you informed.

I ask for your prayers for our Confirmation Candidates who will be going on their Confirmation retreat next weekend, February 10th-12th at Camp Letts. Please pray that they are open to the guidance of the Holy Spirit in deepening their relationship with the Lord Jesus. Pray also for the adults and peer ministers (young people who were confirmed last year) who will accompany the candidates during their retreat.

As you probably know, next Sunday, February 12th, is Super Bowl Sunday. That Sunday, we will join many Churches in participating in "***Souper Bowl Sunday***." While food shopping this coming week, I ask you to consider purchasing cans of soup to bring to the Church on Souper Bowl Sunday. You can place your bagged cans of soup in one of the blue grocery carts located in the Narthex and outside the front doors of the Church. All the donated soups will go to the food pantry at Our Lady of Perpetual Help in Edgewater and will help to feed our brothers and sisters who are facing food insecurity here in South County. Donors can gift up to 100% of their required minimum IRA distribution to their charity or charities of choice. The donation must be made directly to the qualified charity and Holy Family will acknowledge each charitable donation in writing as required by tax law. In lieu of paying taxes on your IRA distribution please consider making a charitable gift with the funds instead. You should of course consult your tax advisor before making a federally tax-free charitable distribution from your IRA.



STOCK DONATIONS TO HOLY FAMILY:
Donating appreciated stock is an efficient way to make a charitable gift. It's easy and it saves the donor from paying capital gains taxes. If you itemize your deductions you are eligible to deduct the full fair market value of the stock, up to IRS limits. Effectively you're able to contribute 20% more than if you sold the stock and paid capital gains taxes. 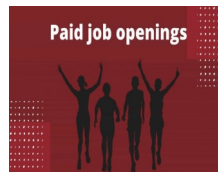
