**4.**We are have daily reflection books for Lent (*FREE*) available on the weekend of Feb. 13-14. We'll have them at all the in-person Masses in the Church and Unity Hall on tables, spread out, in the Narthex and in the JMJ lounge area adjacent to the Hall respectively. After the 11:15am *OUTSIDE* Mass we'll ask everyone to *EXIT THE LOT* by driving by the *PRINCE GEORGE'S COUNTY* side of the lot and there we will have people wearing rubber gloves and masks handing out the books to people in their cars as they drive by.

Those of you who are already enrolled in Faith Direct can also use these links to increase your recurring donations if you believe that you are able to do this. Other options for supporting your parish include setting up your offertory donation through your personal online banking bill pay function. **CARING FOR CREATION:** *Did you know* there are a couple bird feeders in the rear parking area? We put them there two years ago so folks, who otherwise might not have their own feeder, could watch some of God's beautiful creatures up close. If you pull up in you car but not too close and they

fly away, just be patient they will return. Added a bird bath as well this Fall just for fun. So, here we do a combo of mixed seed in one feeder and mix of thistle and sunflower chips in the other to attract a wide variety of songbirds to our area. Both feeders are in squirrel proof feeders that so far have proven quite effective. At home, in addition we put out hulled or shelled sunflower seeds which are a little more expensive, but there is little or no waste. Bonus alert, our Bluebirds love them as well as dried mealworms. You can see several Bluebird nesting boxes around the Church campus which will host new families this spring.
