~ Pastor's Note ~

Last Sunday, February 6th, I attended the virtual Haiti Bull Roast at Our Lady of Perpetual Help (OLPH) to benefit our sister parish of St. Elizabeth of Hungary in Perodin, Haiti, which is in the northern mountainous region of the country. Fr. Rich Gray, the pastor of OLPH, and I participated in drawing the winners of several raffles, one of which included the raffling off of a beautiful quilt, created by members of our Sew Time Ministry here at Holy Family. The winner of the gorgeous handmade quilt was our Holy Family parishioner, Charles Burk.

The virtual Bull Roast raised some \$15,000 for St. Elizabeth Parish School which will help to pay teachers salaries and provide nourishing lunches for the more than 700 children. This lunch is the best meal and maybe the only meal these children will receive that day. From my visit in 2010 to Immaculate Heart of Mary Parish (IHM) in Villardi, Haiti and from working with the Haiti Committee at St. Ignatius Parish in Ijamsville, MD, I have learned that there are no public schools in Haiti.

I thank all the Holy Family parishioners who purchased tickets for the virtual Bull Roast and tickets for the quilt raffle. While at OLPH last Sunday, I learned from the members of the Haiti Committee that a large earthquake struck the Perodin region some three weeks ago. The earthquake damaged the rectory, built of stone in the 1940's. Now, due to the earthquake, the rectory is unsafe and uninhabitable. Fr. Gilford Bourdeau, the pastor and a deacon who had been living in the rectory, now have taken up residence in the school building which fortunately was not damaged by the earthquake.

I am writing this note to you on Tuesday, February 8th. On Wednesday, February 9th, I am planning to attend a meeting at OLPH with Fr. Rich and the members of the Haiti Committee to plan how OPLH and Holy Family Parishes can help our Sister Parish recover from this earthquake. Hopefully, next week, I will be able share with you the discussions and a plan of action resulting from that meeting. Please keep the parishioners of St. Elizabeth in your daily prayers.

Dr. Bob & Julie Sawyer will be coming to our Parish on Monday, February 28th at 7pm. Bob and Julie will be giving a presentation in Unity Hall on **"Praying with Others."** This is an opportunity to deepen your own personal prayer and to learn how to more effectively pray with your family and others. As you may know, after Masses once a month, we have Prayer Teams here at Holy Family who are able to pray with and for fellow parishioners. We are hoping to have more parishioners join these Prayer Teams. Each team has three to four members who pray with one individual parishioner after Mass. I invite you to join us on Monday, February 28th at 7pm in Unity Hall.

Lastly, please save the date to attend our second Synod meeting on Tuesday, February 22nd at 7pm in Unity Hall. It will be similar to the first meeting where we had small round table group discussions with a leader/staff member at each table.

LET THE REPAIRS BEGIN ON THE BIRD HOUSES!

CARING FOR CREATION: Oh, these Winter doldrums. The ground is frozen all the plants are sound asleep. Sure, there's a few evergreens to give us hope and I enjoy looking at the red berries on the female holly trees. But even they are in hibernation. Soon enough they will begin to ripen and become food for the birds and soon enough there will be so much to do. So, right now I am working on the bluebird houses. I have a couple here at home and of course there are a half dozen or so there at the Church. Each one will have to be inspected and repaired as necessary. Each one needs to be cleaned out of all the old nesting materials for the new season ahead. There's other little oddball chores in the garden that can be done but I'm leaving the leaf litter alone until the insect population emerges in the spring which provides food for the foraging birds. Bird baths both at Church and home get filled every day now.

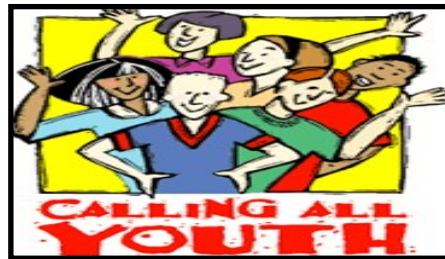
