Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

Well, just a **COUPLE** of things happening this week!: Lent is starting! If you are registered in our parish, you would have received a paper copy of our schedule in the mail by now. Otherwise you can click on the icon for the Lent schedule on the homepage of holyfamilychurch.com **OR** on our Facebook page.

This Tuesday, February 25th at 5pm we have our Youth sponsored Pancake Supper in Unity Hall. Cost is \$25 family "immediate," \$5 per person and kids 4 and under eat free. Also, on Wednesday, February 26th we start the Lenten Season with Ash Wednesday. Mass times are 6:30am, 9am, 5pm and 7pm AND we have a Noon Prayer Service with ashes (not a Mass).

On Ash Wednesday and all the Fridays of Lent along with Good Friday, Catholics are asked to abstain from meat and also to eat **ONE** normal meal along with two small meals, and no snacking.

For Lent we sometimes talk about "giving something up" like chocolate or sweets....but maybe this year pray about WHAT YOU REALLY NEED TO WORK ON. So, could it be to give up bad language or too much screen time or gossip? Could it be you need to ADD something like being kinder with our words, giving to charity, increasing our time praying, reading Scripture or being regular in coming to Mass? Let's really pray on this my brothers and sisters, between now and Ash Wednesday, for the THEME of our Lent here at Holy Family this year is "CHANGE OUR HEARTS" and maybe we can make some headway, in allowing Christ to change our hearts, by identifying what we need to work on this Lent.

ADORATION MINISTRY NEWS: Did you know that Holy Family Catholic parish has a Perpetual Eucharistic Adoration ministry? What is Eucharistic Adoration? Eucharistic Adoration is visiting and spending time with Jesus in the Sacred Host. It is an expression of our love for Jesus, who loves us so much that He never

wants to leave us and stays with us day and night in the Blessed Sacrament. Perpetual Eucharistic Adoration is when a parish sets aside a small room, in our case the Adoration Oratory, that is open 24 hours a day, 7 days a week, with the permanent exposition of Jesus in the Most Blessed Sacrament, the Holy Eucharist. Father Andy and members of the Adoration Ministry, will be speaking at all of the Masses next weekend, February 22nd & 23rd. We will have the opportunity to sign up as regular scheduled adorers, periodic scheduled adorers (sharing hours with other adorers), and substitutes following each of the Masses.

DEACON DOUG'S Q & A: A paten, a purificator, and a corporal are all liturgical objects. Do you know what each is used for at Mass?

Question: Answer to last week's question about cathedrals and basilicas: A cathedral is the principal church of a diocese, while basilica is the name given to certain churches granted special privileges by the pope. A "cathedra" (Latin for chair) is the chair or throne of a bishop. Baltimore's cathedral, Mary Our Queen, is located in north Baltimore. Baltimore's first cathedral, the first in the US, the Assumption of the Blessed Virgin Mary, is now a basilica and is located downtown

LENTEN REGULATIONS: Abstinence from meat is to be observed by all Catholics 14 years and older on Good Friday and all Fridays during Lent. **Fasting** is to be observed on Good Friday by all Catholics who are 18 years of age but not yet 59. Those who are bound by this may take only one full meal. Two smaller meals are permitted, if necessary, to maintain strength according to one's needs, but eating solid foods between meals is not permitted. Catholics should not lightly excuse themselves from these prescribed minimal penitential practices.




