We recently received a letter of thanks from Judith Crownshield, the Executive Director of Mary's Center in Pasadena, MD, for our parish's recent contribution of \$1,436. Mary's Center helps mothers who are in need of the essentials of life for their children.

March is National Colorectal Cancer Awareness Month. Colon Cancer is increasing in younger adults, including women. I know of one Holy Family young adult woman parishioner who recently passed from Colon Cancer. I know of another young woman, a parishioner at St. Ignatius Parish in Ijamsville, where I was Pastor before coming to Holy Family, who was diagnosed with Colon Cancer before this past Christmas. Medical doctors have recently lowered the age from 50 to 45 years old where they recommend that all adult men and women should have a Colonoscopy. If Colon Cancer is diagnosed early, it is readily treatable. So, if you are between 45 years to 50 years of age or are older and have not yet had a Colonoscopy, please consult with your doctor.

On Saturday, February 26th, the Secular Franciscan Order Pope St. John XXIII Fraternity, which meets at Holy Family, gathered for a morning Mass during which three women and two men made a profession of faith. The Mass was celebrated by Rev. Patrick Monahan OFM, Cap. One of those professing was our parishioner, Joseph O'Dea. **Congratulations Joe!**

We will have (or had if you are reading the bulletin on Sunday, March 6th) the RCIA Rite of Sending at the 9:15am Mass, this Sunday, March 6th. Since last Fall, these adults have been attending Tuesday Night classes focusing on Jesus and the Catholic Faith and now have made a decision to become a Catholic. As a parish we are "sending" them to participate in the Rite of Election, which will be celebrated by Archbishop Lori at 2pm this Sunday, March 6th at the Cathedral of Mary Our Queen.

After the Rite of Election, the Catechumens and the Candidates will then be among the Elect, who and have been called by the Archbishop to become Catholic and receive the Easter Sacraments of Baptism, Confirmation and Eucharist at the Easter Vigil on Holy Saturday night. In your Lenten prayers, please pray for **Catechumens** (those being baptized) Tammy Kelly, Madeline Madsen, Candace Turner, and Kelly Turner and **Candidates** Thomas Trepener and Carolyn Howard (who are baptized and will be confirmed) as they continue their spiritual journeys.


STOCK DONATIONS TO HOLY FAMILY:

Effectively you're able to contribute 20% more than if you sold the stock and paid capital gains taxes. The donation must be made directly to the qualified charity and Holy Family will acknowledge each charitable donation in writing as required by tax law. **You should of course consult your tax advisor before making a federally tax-free charitable distribution from your IRA.**

DEACON DOUG'S Q & A: What are we asked to do during Lent?

Answer to last week's question about the Church Fathers: Church Fathers were influential Christian theologians and writers who, from the 1st to the 8th Century, established the intellectual and doctrinal foundations of Christianity during three different periods: Apostolic Fathers who knew the apostles; Ante-Nicene (before the Council of Nicea that gave us the Nicene Creed); and Post-Nicene (from 325 to 800 AD). While the numbers vary, prominent Fathers include saints such as Augustine, Clement of Rome, Jerome and John Chrysostom.
