Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

The Second Sunday of Lent for the Gospel reading we have the Transfiguration of Jesus on Mt. Tabor. This is an experience of the disciples Peter, James and John, where they see Jesus transformed and are given a glimpse of who Jesus really is: The Son of Man, the Messiah.

Interestingly, this "glimpse" of Jesus "as He really is" and the walk up the steep sides of Mt Tabor comes AFTER Peter declares Jesus to be "the Christ" (Christ is the Greek word for "Messiah.") So, Peter perceived who Jesus "really was" before seeing it with his own eyes on Mt. Tabor.

May we be the same as St. Peter in our own spiritual lives as we work on growing in faith this Lent.

Of course, I wish that Jesus were more overt in showing Himself to us – in showing us how He is working, and that He is near (along with all the saints): For it might be helpful to us, when we are feeling frustrated, to have a vision of Jesus or Mary, or a voice from on high to encourage us (!), but, just like St. Peter, we need to be able to see that God is with us this Lent (through having faith) amidst the subtleties of our prayer, going to Mass and confession, helping others, loving others and reading Scripture.

Indeed, there is a song, written by Christian singer Michael W. Smith, that is currently getting a lot of play on Christian radio that addresses that Jesus is working in our lives even when we don't perceive it. The lyrics for "Waymaker" at one point go like this:

Even when I don't see it, You're working, Even when I can't feel it, You're working, You never stop, You never stop working, You never stop, You never stop working.

May we remember that this Lent!

ADORATION MINISTRY NEWS: Did you know that Holy Family Catholic parish has a Perpetual Eucharistic Adoration ministry? What is Eucharistic Adoration? Eucharistic Adoration is visiting and spending time with Jesus in the

Sacred Host. It is an expression of our love for Jesus, who loves us so much that He never wants to leave us and stays with us day and night in the Blessed Sacrament. Perpetual Eucharistic Adoration is when a parish sets aside a small room, in our case the Adoration Oratory, that is open 24 hours a day, 7 days a week, with the permanent exposition of Jesus in the Most Blessed Sacrament, the Holy Eucharist. Please know that you can sign up at www.holyfamilychurch.com and find the "Adoration" icon on the home page. Click on that icon to sign up. Please also know two things: 1. That you can sign up for once or twice a month to pray at a given time slot AND that 2. You can sign up on time slots that are already taken (the more people involved the better). DEACON DOUG'S Q & A: Question: Ash Wednesday was the start of Lent. Why do we call this forty day period of penance before Easter

Answer to last week's question about the "Chancellor" of a diocese: According to Canon Law, the primary function of the Chancellor is to serve as the chief record-keeper of the Diocese, ensuring that all records of the Diocese are gathered, arranged, and safeguarded in the Diocesan Archives. The Chancellor also serves as the chief notary of the Diocese. The position can be held by a priest, deacon, or lay person. In our Diocese, Baltimore's Chancellor is Dr. Diane

LENTEN REGULATIONS: Abstinence from meat is to be observed by all Catholics 14 years and older on Good Friday and all Fridays during Lent. Fasting is to be observed on Good Friday by all Catholics who are 18 years of age but not yet 59. Those who are bound by this may take only one full meal. Two smaller meals are permitted, if necessary, to maintain strength according to one's needs, but eating solid foods between meals is not permitted. Catholics should not lightly excuse themselves from these prescribed minimal penitential practices.
