# ~ Pastor's Note ~

Earlier this year I announced that Christy Cosgrove, our parish's Director of Adult Enrichment, had shared with me that she was resigning from her position as she and her husband will be moving out of Maryland. Subsequently, I have formed a search committee of parishioners chaired by Cyndi Zajic, our parish's Director of Family Ministry and Fellowship Ministry, to review the applicants who apply for the Director of Adult Enrichment position. The position is now listed on the <a href="archbalt.org">archbalt.org</a> website (click on careers and then jobs). If you or someone you know would like to apply for this position, please go to above website and complete the application process. My hope is that we will interview candidates and we will hopefully then select a candidate for this position by the end of April. Please pray as the Search Committee begins their work.

Recently, several parishioners shared with me that before the Pandemic, Fr. Andy Aaron celebrated a 7am Mass on Thursdays during Lent. The 7am Mass allowed some parishioners to attend Mass before going to work. During this Lent, we will have *two* Masses on Thursday, one at 7am and the second being at 9am.

Beginning this week, our parish will begin the process of changing the software by which we keep parish information, including the names and a contact information for parishioners and our financial data. Currently, we have been keeping all of our data through ParishSOFT, which will no longer be providing support. We will be moving to Ministry Platform, which was selected by the Archdiocese. I thank Donna Wardrup, Jean Phillips and all the members of our Parish Staff who have been preparing for this change. Although our parish is not the first parish staff to make this change, I ask for your prayers that the conversion goes smoothly.

We have 75 candidates preparing to receive the Sacrament of Confirmation here at Holy Family on Saturday, May 28th. Due to the Pandemic, we had to cancel the Confirmation retreat which was originally scheduled to be held in January. We have rescheduled the retreat to be held here at Holy Family next Friday and Saturday, March 18th & 19th. Please pray for our candidates that each of them has a good retreat.




