FOURTH SUNDAY OF LENT



CARING FOR CREATION: The construction of a bird's nest is quite a feat of nature. I typically see twigs, sticks, dried grass and leaves used as nest-building materials when cleaning out nesting boxes, If you have any bird houses, now is the time to clean them out. Some birds will use pretty much anything they can

find for their construction efforts ([visit https://www.audubon.org/news/what-nesting-materials-are-safe-birds](https://www.audubon.org/news/what-nesting-materials-are-safe-birds)). We might wonder if it is OK to put out material for our birds. It is, so long as they are of the right type. The best things are those that birds seek out in nature including twigs, small sticks, leaves and small pieces of straw, according to the Audubon Society. Less obvious natural materials birds may use for nests include bark strips, pine needles, feathers, grass clippings and plant material such as down from cottonwood trees or the fluffy material from cattails.

I like using a suet feeder placed near the bird feeders so I can see them in action collecting the supplies. Some of the best supplies are going to be provided by the native plants growing in natural areas. That's how this cycle of life works with the birds and the plants evolving together.

There are some problematic materials though. Long hair, string, cellophane strips (think Easter baskets) tinsel and yarn can be an entanglement problem for both the birds and the nestlings. They do become less problematic if cut in one to two inch strips. Lint from a dryer is a big problem because it holds water and moisture and should be avoided. Many of today's clothes are made from manufactured materials and plastic of any kind and should not be placed in the environment.

- ◆ Pope John Paul II decreed the Sunday after Easter as "Divine Mercy Sunday," on May 5th, 2000.

DEACON DOUG'S Q & A: Why does the Church use purple in vestments, altar decorations etc., during Lent?

Answer to the question about the Scriptural Way: Yes, relatively new. Pope John Paul II introduced a new form of the devotion, called the Scriptural Way of the Cross, on Good

Friday in 1991. Out of the fourteen traditional Stations of the Cross, only eight have clear scriptural foundation. John Paul II hoped to provide a version of this devotion more closely aligned with the biblical accounts.
