CARING FOR CREATION: Did vou know it is time to re-engage your rain barrels? Here are a few tips to get yours ready for Spring. Disconnect the barrel and turn on its side and rinse out any algae and other foreign matter. I have seen frogs and tadpoles in them so be careful. I suspect that eggs get

washed off birds feet and flow into the barrel. If you have a soaker hose left on the ground over the Winter you can bring your garden hose over and connect to the soaker and apply some water pressure to flush it out. At install you should have drilled some 1/8" drill bit or used a leather punch every foot or so. Reinstall the soaker hose.

- So, there are two setups seen in popular use. A diverter sends rain water from the downspout into the barrel and there is a faucet at the bottom to fill a watering can or connect a hose to water a garden that is lower than the barrel. The other setup has a soaker hose connected and snaked through the garden to water slowly and continuously long after the rain has stopped (no work method). The most important thing is to capture that first bit of rainfall that is washing the ozone and nitrogen off the roof and insuring that it is soaked into the ground as fertilizer and not washed into our streams and bay.
- At the Chapel you will see both methods employed. The soaker hose, covered by mulch, is connected to an upper faucet and a lower faucet is available to water flowers and plants as needed. The second thing is to slow down the flow of water and release it over time. When a surge of water enters our stream system it causes erosion sending sediment downstream and smothering plant life and the breeding grounds for fish, oysters and crabs. "Slow it down and spread it around.'

Spring is here! Remember the Outdoor Stations of the Cross are at the rear of the Church. There are booklets there to help guide you in prayer as well and contemplation 24/7. There are several benches to just sit. The rear parking area is now well lit with brand new low energy LED lights.

DEACON DOUG'S Q & A: What three symbols are on the new Paschal Candle that will be lit at the Easter Vigil?

Answer to last week's question about Jesus on the donkey: Jesus entered Jerusalem as a humble King of peace. Riding on a donkey symbolized arrival in peace, rather than arriving on a horse as a warwaging king. Jesus riding a young donkey not yet ridden fulfilled the prophecy of the prophet Zechariah. A donkey, never before ridden and which made no resistance to Jesus, showed God's divine sovereignty over the animal kingdom. (Zech 9) It also reflected the sacrifice by Abraham of his son Isaac who rode a donkey to be slain on the altar. (Genesis 49:10-12).
