Brother's and Sister's in Christ,

We will be livestreaming weekend Mass next every Saturday at 5pm until public Masses are again allowed. I am sorry but we can't invite you all to attend. Please tune in through our Facebook page and website at www.holyfamilychurch.com.

At this point, the Parish Office remains open regular business hours but we asking folks to call the office ahead of any visits to minimize contact with the staff. We'll also be continuing to communicate through our bulletin (access on-line at www.holyfamilychurch.com) and email blasts. If you want to be on that list, contact Donna at office@hfccmail.org and through video messages.

We will be livestreaming daily Mass Monday – Friday at 9am each day until further notice, Stations of the Cross on Fridays at noon each week and a video message from the parish at 2pm each Tuesday.

We are changing some previously-announced decisions to have the Church open for Exposition and Adoration on a daily basis and on Sundays and to keep our Oratory and Chapel open. After some discussion with Staff, we decided that, despite our efforts to disinfect and clean our premises on a daily basis, we are concerned about people being contagious coming to our campus and causing others to become sick. We are worried that some of or very strongest prayer warriors, who want to come to the Oratory and to the Church and Chapel to pray, are also those who might be vulnerable – including the elderly. It was mentioned that people have witnessed others who had been coughing and who appeared sick had been seen coming to our Church. BECAUSE OF THIS, WE ARE GOING TO CLOSE OUR CHURCH, CHAPEL AND ORATORY UNTIL FURTHER NOTICE. Right now, as this bulletin goes to print we are not 100% sure what is happening for Palm Sunday weekend and Easter weekend, we'll let you know about that as soon as is possible.

DRIVE THROUGH CONFESSIONS: We will be having confessions at 7pm - 830pm each Wednesday and 3pm - 430pm on Saturday. Also on April 1st we will have confessions from 9:45am - 11am. Just drive to the front of the Church and follow the signs. It all has gone really smoothly so far.

ASSISTING THOSE IN NEED: Our parish always has ongoing efforts to support those who are in need. Unfortunately, at the time these groups need our help MORE THAN EVER. Our parish is in an unusual circumstance of not being able to meet together. SO, we are asking you to look closely at the following in order to continue to support these worthy programs.

- ♦ OUR DAILY BREAD is making casseroles on site. Catholic Charities has put in place a restricted donation so that all money made payable to Our Daily Bread Employment will go straight to feeding the guests. You can mail the check to Our Daily Bread Employment Center, 725 Fallsway, Baltimore, MD 21202. In addition they are in dire need of unopened bread and peanut butter. Linda Wilk, from our parish, will collect peanut butter and bread on Saturday, March 28th from 10am until Noon in front of the Church.
- LIGHT HOUSE SHELTER is in desperate need of food and cleaning supplies. To better assist them we are asking that rather than buy the items, you write a monetary check directly payable to Light House Shelter, 10 Hudson St., Annapolis MD 21401. This will allow them to buy the materials needed online.

WE ARE GOING TO BE WORKING OUT THE DETAILS ON OUR STAFF IN THE NEXT DAY OR TWO REGARDING THIS SO THAT IT WILL BE SAFE AND THE PARISH CAN PROVIDE ASSISTANCE IF ANY PARISHIONER IS DEALING WITH A COMPLICATED SITUATION AS A VOLUNTEER.

Please remember that I am still going to houses to offer the Sacrament of the Sick, etc. Though, be aware that if someone in your family has the Coronavirus, that I would need to be quarantined if I saw them in person, effectively shutting me off from the whole parish. So let's use discretion.

Keep praying friends and hopefully soon we will praying together at Mass.

The Mysteries of the Rosary

Have you ever wanted to explore the life of Jesus and Mary in a deeper way? Each decade highlights a sacred episode:

Joyful Mysteries: Through the Annunciation (1) and Visitation (2), we get a glimpse at Mary's joyful yes to God. She gives birth to Jesus in the Nativity (3). Mary and Joseph present their son at the temple (4) and bring him there again when he is a teenager (5).

Luminous Mysteries: Jesus is baptized in the Jordan River (1) before Mary gives him a nudge to his first miracle at Cana (2). Jesus proclaims the Gospel (3), is transfigured on Mount Tabor (4), and institutes the Eucharist (5). The light is shining!

Sorrowful Mysteries: Jesus prays in agony in Gethsemane (1), knowing his hour of suffering has come. After his betrayal and arrest, Jesus is scourged (2) and crowned with thorns (3). He carries his cross (4), and Mary stands at the foot of the cross as he is crucified (5).

Glorious Mysteries: Christ is risen in glory (1)! After appearing to those he loves, he ascends into heaven (2). Jesus' followers receive the Holy Spirit at Pentecost (3). Mary, unaffected by original sin, is assumed body and soul into heaven (4), where she is crowned queen, humble mother of Christ the King (5).

DEACON DOUG'S Q & A: *Question:* On Palm Sunday all the gospels describe Jesus riding on a donkey being greeted by palms. Why a donkey and is their a special significance to the palms?

Answer to last week's question about Laetare Sunday: Laetare means to rejoice. And this Sunday, coming after the middle of Lent (the Thursday before) traditionally has been viewed as a day on which the austerity of Lent is briefly lessened. It is meant to give us hope and encouragement as we progress towards Easter. Vestments are rose; flowers and music encouraged. Laetare means rejoice. Gaudete, which is used for the third Sunday in Advent, also means rejoice. In Advent we anticipate the birth of Chirst; in Lent, His resurrection.

SEW ANGELS: We have received an urgent request from several area facilities for the need of sewn masks including AAMC (see attached email/pattern). If you are able to make some of these at home and can drop them off to either Pam or Barbara (addresses

below) and leave on our porches we will make sure they get to those in need. They are very easy to make and sew up quickly. If you need fabric please let us know and we will leave on our porches for you as well. If you don't sew, but would like to cut out fabric, the sizes are 9x6 inches and we need two pieces of fabric per mask (100% cotton). If you use flannel for one side – prewash the flannel as it shrinks. Some are also inserting light interfacing in between the layers to give the mask shape/filter. Please let us know if you have any questions. You can also make ties/binding instead of elastic (20") across top and bottom if you don't have the elastic available.
