HOLY FAMILY

Dear Friends,

Alleluia, Christ is Risen!! Please know that we are praying for you as we enter into the Easter Season.

There is a book entitled "A Case for Christ. A Journalist's Personal Investigation of the Evidence for Jesus" by Lee Stroebel where he looks at how the apostles were hiding and afraid at the time of Jesus' crucifixion....but then after the event (they claimed) that Jesus had risen from the dead, they all fanned out around the world, going from South India to Spain preaching this. That all but one of them even went to their death rather than recant their statements that they'd seen Him rise from the dead.

Stroebel says indeed that: Jesus said He was God – so either He was God or He was a liar or He was crazy.

Stroebel adds, Jesus was not just a good person or a good teacher, because Jesus said that He was God. In the Gospels Jesus called Himself "**The Son of Man**" 80 times. His listeners in the Jewish community got furious because they, rightly, interpreted His saying this as connecting to the Book of Daniel 7:13-14 where Daniel writes about seeing a great king of all and Daniel calls Him the "**son of man.**" *I saw coming with the clouds of heaven, one like a son of man. When He reached the Ancient of Days and was presented before him, He received dominion, splendor, and kingship; all nations, peoples and tongues will serve Him. His dominion is an everlasting dominion that shall not pass away, His kingship, one that shall not be destroyed.* So, Jesus was letting the people of His time know that He was the Messiah, the Savior, and the King of all.

The New Testament says that Jesus said that He could forgive sins (Matthew 9:1-7) and that He could raise people from the dead (John 11:1-44.) Jesus also claimed to give people eternal life (John 10: 27-28), and that He was the Messiah (Mark 14:61-62).

Stroebel, again writes: *Jesus said He was God – so either He was God or He was a liar or He was crazy.*

Well, what if we said that Jesus was a liar. This doesn't seem to square with His goodness. How does this explain what happened after Jesus died on the cross, anyway, if all of His disciples, who were terrified before his death, would have all agreed to leave all of their loved ones behind, and face torture and death....for a lie?

So then, Stroebel looks at maybe Jesus was crazy. Though that, again, doesn't seem to square itself with Jesus being one of the greatest moral teachers of all time. Also, again, could it have been that all of His disciples were crazy about the same single idea? That seems unlikely too.

So, since our faith is one that involved real events testified to by real people, we have at Easter, the event of the Resurrection and the impact it had on a large number of verifiable people who really did go all over claiming He had risen from the dead and that He was God.

No matter how amazing it all is, it is more probable than the amazing coincidence that all these people were crazy together or all liars together and yet they all gave their lives for the same crazy idea or set of lies.

So, He did rise from the dead. He is God. That's who He claimed to be after all. He loves you and died for you and wants to walk with you as your Savior this Easter. So, that's a reason to have a Happy Easter.

NEXT SUNDAY, Apr. 11th at 3pm we will have Mr. Mark Forrest, Irish Tenor, with a program of music and prayer in the Church for Divine Mercy Sunday. His program will include the recitation of the Divine Mercy Chaplet in song.

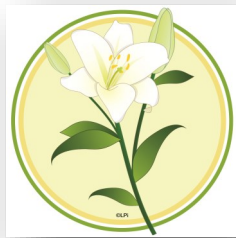
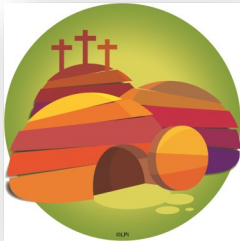
