~ *Pastor's Note* ~

In conversation with mothers of infants in our parish community, they expressed an interest in having a room here at Church in which they could nurse their child and still be able to participate in the Mass. In addressing this need, we have recently created a room for these mothers and nursing babies on the lower level under our Church. The Serenity Room is located down the steps on the right side of the Narthex. Then open the door at the bottom of the staircase and go around the corner to the **"Serenity Room"** on the left. The Serenity Room has a couch, loveseat and chairs, including a rocking chair. There is also a television on which the Mass being held in our Church is being livestreamed. The doors of the Serenity Room have privacy shades. If you have any suggestions for anything needed in this room to make this room more welcoming to mothers and their babies, please just let me or a staff member know.

One of the many challenges which many incarcerated prisoners face, beyond their legal situation, is that they may have not graduated from High School. Shirley Theimer, a Holy Family parishioner, has been working with others for several years now providing educational instruction for inmates being held at the Jennifer Road Detention Center here in Anne Arundel County. Their goal is to help the men and women to work towards getting their GED certificate.

Shirley is seeking additional volunteers, especially persons to tutor in the areas of Language Arts and Social Studies. Several Holy Family parishioners have already volunteered. Teaching experience is not a requirement. For more information about this program, you can contact her at 410-573-0833. Thank you for your consideration of helping in this program.

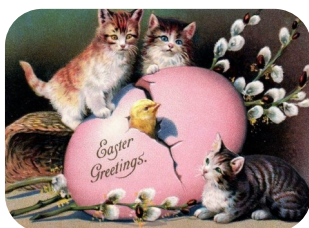

As I have explained in earlier bulletins, the purpose of the committee is to examine all aspects of our parish's life such as worship; prayer; evangelization; faith formation for all ages; youth ministry; service and witness; facilities and parking; communication and community relations. At our last meeting, the committee members were asked to go out into their communities and observe their various surroundings. This can be referred to as **"Neighborhood Reading."** I ask for your prayers as we continue this process and begin to dream and envision what we would like our parish to become making us more vibrant as Disciples of the Risen Christ in the years to come.

Lastly, next Sunday, April 16th, is Divine Mercy Sunday. I invite all parishioners to join for an hour of Devotion beginning at 2pm in our Church. We will have the Veneration of the Divine Mercy image, Exposition and Adoration of the Blessed Sacrament and an opportunity to receive the Sacrament of Reconciliation. 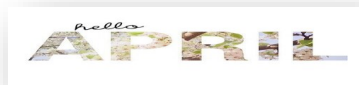

EASTER SUNDAY

CARING FOR CREATION: This time of year I am reminded that God is a part of my life all day long. Not just in the morning when I wake up or when I say Grace. Whether it's the sound of squirrels rustling in the leaves or the blue birds chirping on the tree limbs while walking Maddie and Sophie, the world is waking up again, and God is holding my hand.

Two of my favorite birds are now in full color. The male Goldfinches are now a bright gold to attract mates while the females remain muted to remain unseen on the nest. To attract them, a thistle feeder is required. They have small slots in them that dispense the tiny thistle seeds one at a time. Ace Hardware Store has a thistle finch mix that includes little chips of sunflower seeds.

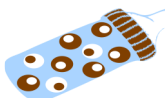
The Bluebirds are bright blue right now for the same reason. All winter they were dull and colorless. Now they are just fabulous. If you want to attract them to your yard, they really like mealworms. They are freeze dried and a renewable resource available at hardware and wild bird stores as well as on line. Installing a bluebird nesting box 6 feet off the ground is surely going to used 2 or 3 times a season. There are seven located on the Church grounds and even one at Father Mike's home. There are mothers caring for the eggs right now as you read this today.

It's not too late, if you need help installing your feeders or nesting boxes, please let me know. I am ever so grateful that folks have asked for help and I'd be glad help you too. Did I tell you my favorite songbird is the Carolina Wren? Well, that's for another day.

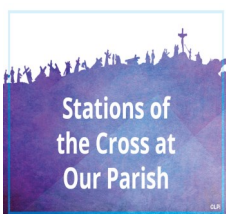
