# ~ Pastor's Note ~

In December of 2020, Seminarian Shiadrik Mokum left his native country of Cameroon to complete his theological studies and pastoral formation in preparation for being ordained a priest and serving here in our Archdiocese of Baltimore. Our Parish sponsors Shiadrik providing him lodging during the school year when he is not at seminary.

In May, Shiadrik will finish his Second Year of Theology at Mt. St. Mary's Seminary in Emmittsburg. As he continues his formation, our Parish recently was able to purchase a late model automobile for Shiadrik. We drew funds from a Holy Family Seminarian Account to purchase the car. A Holy Family parishioner learned that the car was for sale and contacted me. A second Holy Family parishioner examined the car and determined that it could be a safe and dependable car for Shiadrik to drive. This second parishioner is now working on the car so that it can pass Maryland Inspection. We are hoping that the work on the car will be completed soon and the car will then pass Maryland State Inspection. Shiadrik will then have his first car so that, for example, he will be able to have his own transportation allowing him to visit homebound parishioners and those being cared for in a hospital.

There are other seminarians who have left family and their country to come here to prepare to serve as priests in our Archdiocese. Fr. Stephen Roth, The Director of Vocations of the Archdiocese of Baltimore, has asked his brother priests, in turn, to ask their parishioners to be on the look out for any possible donation of a used car or a low priced car for other seminarians to drive. If you know of such a vehicle, please contact me.

Presently, our Archdiocese has over 50 Seminarians in formation, including those now in College Seminary, Major Seminary or in their Pastoral Year in a Parish. We need more holy priests to minister in our Archdiocese.

The Vocations Office is sponsoring a four day overnight retreat experience for High School age young men to discern their path of Catholic Discipleship. The Retreat's name is "QUO-VADIS" which translates to "Where are you going?" The retreat, July 11-14, 2022 is being planned by the seminarians who are completing their Pastoral Year. The retreat is being held at St. Mary's Seminary in Baltimore from which I graduated.

We have two young men from Holy Family who have already registered for the retreat. There is a cost to attend but our Parish will help to defray or pay the full cost of the retreat. **CARING FOR CREATION:** Gold and blue, God save Ukraine. It is Spring with hope and life emerges eternal. Two of my favorite birds are now in full color. The male Goldfinches are now a bright gold to attract mates while the females remain muted to remain unseen on the nest by predators. To attract them, a thistle feeder is required. They

have small slots in them that dispense the tiny thistle seeds one at a time. Ace Hardware has a thistle finch mix that includes little chips of sunflower seeds

The Bluebirds are bright blue right now for the same reason. All winter they were dull and colorless. Now they are just fabulous! If you want to attract them to your yard, they really like mealworms. They are freeze dried and a renewable resource available at hardware and wild bird stores as well as on line. Installing a bluebird nesting box 6 feet off the ground is surely going to be used 2 or 3 times a season. There are a half dozen located on the Church grounds and even one over at Father Mike's too.

**DEACON DOUG'S Q & A:** What is the Pascal Candle? When is it lit?

Answer to the question about the significance of the Easter Vigil: Among Western Christian the Easter Vigil is the most important liturgy of public worship of the liturgical year as it celebrates the Resurrection of Christ. After 40 days of Lent "Alleluia" is proclaimed.. The Roman Missal states: "Of this night's Vigil, it is the greatest and most noble of all solemnities. There are four parts: The Service of Light (blessing of the Pascal Candle); The Liturgy of the Word (both Old and New Testament readings); The Rite of Baptism for catechumens; and Liturgy of the Eucharist.


