**ENVIRONMENTAL MINISTREE:** *Did you know* it's important to clean out your birdhouses every spring? A lot can happen inside over the winter since last year. There are a half dozen each at Church and in my yard. I found swarming ants, a couple paper wasp nests, and lots of odd beetles. In some cases old nests were a soggy mess. A clean fresh empty house affords the best opportunity for a successful nesting season. Oh, I reached into one of the boxes out back of the Church and a nesting bluebird flew out screaming at the top of her lungs. I about fell over. Bluebirds often have multiple clutches in a season so a month or so after seeing birds using a house, it will get cleaned out again after the babies have fledged the nest. In the case of most cavity nesters, one egg is laid one each day until the entire clutch is complete. Incubation will then begin. For bluebirds, incubation typically lasts approximately 12-14 days. After hatching, the chicks will remain in the nest for about **17-21 days**.

**The Mysteries of the Rosary**

Have you ever wanted to explore the life of Jesus and Mary in a deeper way? Each decade highlights a sacred episode:

**Joyful Mysteries:** Through the Annunciation (1) and Visitation (2), we get a glimpse at Mary's joyful yes to God. She gives birth to Jesus in the Nativity (3). Mary and Joseph present their son at the temple (4) and bring him there again when he is a teenager (5).

**Luminous Mysteries:** Jesus is baptized in the Jordan River (1) before Mary gives him a nudge to his first miracle at Cana (2). Jesus proclaims the Gospel (3), is transfigured on Mount Tabor (4), and institutes the Eucharist (5). The light is shining!

**Sorrowful Mysteries:** Jesus prays in agony in Gethsemane (1), knowing his hour of suffering has come. After his betrayal and arrest, Jesus is scourged (2) and crowned with thorns (3). He carries his cross (4), and Mary stands at the foot of the cross as he is crucified (5).

**Glorious Mysteries:** Christ is risen in glory (1)! After appearing to those he loves, he ascends into heaven (2). Jesus' followers receive the Holy Spirit at Pentecost (3). Mary, unaffected by original sin, is assumed body and soul into heaven (4), where she is crowned queen, humble mother of Christ the King (5).

**EVERYDAY STEWARDSHIP - RECOGNIZE GOD IN YOUR ORDINARY MOMENTS**

**Recognizing the Voice of Jesus**

When my wireless provider introduced HD Voice, the voice I heard on my phone was unbelievably clear, and it felt at times like both the caller and I were in the same room. The best aspect of this feature is that it didn't cost the customer any additional fees, and it didn't require any changes to the phone. I could say it was free, but I suspect I was already paying for it in my monthly bill anyway. At least it felt free.

The clearer the voice calling you, the easier it is to recognize who it is on the other end of the line. In John's Gospel, Jesus speaks of the gatekeeper who opens the gate and calls for his sheep. They respond because they know his voice. Others try to lure the sheep when the gatekeeper is not there, but the sheep find their voices unclear or unfamiliar.

Jesus is our gatekeeper. But unlike receiving something for free from a wireless company, to be able to hear his voice we need to pay attention and practice listening. By developing a stewardship way of life that is mindful and prayerful, we become attuned to his voice and are able to discern when the call is from our Lord and when it is from an imposter. It is great to talk about all the things we can do and all the gifts we can share, but if we are not listening for his call to hear where our offerings are needed, we can end up like a lost sheep searching for the gatekeeper.

**SEW ANGELS:** We have received an urgent request from several area facilities for the need of sewn masks including AAMC (see attached email/pattern). If you are able to make some of these at home and can drop them off to either Pam or Barbara (addresses below) and leave on our porches we will make sure they get to those in need. They are very easy to make and sew up quickly. If you need fabric please let us know and we will leave on our porches for you as well. If you don't sew, but would like to cut out fabric, the sizes are 9x6 inches and we need two pieces of fabric per mask (100% cotton). If you use flannel for one side – prewash the flannel as it shrinks. Some are also inserting light interfacing in between the layers to give the mask shape/filter. Please let us know if you have any questions. You can also make ties/binding instead of elastic (20") across top and bottom if you don't have the elastic available.
