~ *Pastor's Note* ~

Our Youth Minister John Freiland has left our parish staff to pursue a new chapter in his life. I thank John for his three years of ministry here at Holy Family to our youth and their families while also coordinating preparation for the Sacrament of Confirmation.

In the coming months I will be meeting with our youth, their parents and our staff members to chart a path forward for youth ministry here at our parish.

Have you seen either of our two red HVAC thermometers in the Narthex? They are on the two brick walls on the far right and left of the double doors that lead into our Church. As of this past Tuesday, May 16th, we have received \$22,728 in just the first two weeks of our campaign. These gifts combined with the \$50,000 from our reserve fund, give us a total of \$72,728 or 11% towards our goal of \$630,000!

Every dollar given during this two year campaign is cathedraticum free, which means every dollar will go toward the purchasing and installing our new HVAC System. If you would like to make your contribution thru Faith Direct, you can contribute to the maintenance collection on Faith Direct. If you would like assistance in choosing this option for the campaign, feel free to call the Parish Office. Thank you for your support!

As I mentioned in a previous Pastor's note, Fr. Bill Spacek has served as the priest chaplain at Anne Arundel Medical Center (AAMC) for a number of years. He was recently appointed as the new priest chaplain at St. Agnes Hospital in West Baltimore, beginning his ministry there on this past May 1st. I thank Fr. Bill for his years of service to patients and their families at AAMC.

At this time, the Archdiocese is hoping to have a priest assigned to AAMC as the Catholic hospital priest chaplain beginning July 1st. Parishioners from St. Mary's parish in Annapolis will continue to bring the Eucharist to Catholics who are patients at AAMC.

If you have an operation scheduled at AAMC or any other hospital, please call me and I will anoint you before you enter the hospital. If you are a patient or you have a loved one who is a patient at AAMC or any other hospital, please call me and I will be glad to visit you or your family member.

I look forward to seeing you all at the Parish Picnic on Sunday, June 11th from 12:30pm-2:30pm in Unity Hall and on the back parking lot of our Campus. 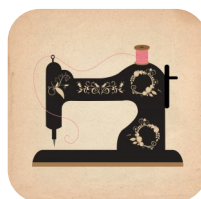

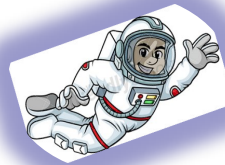
