Dear Brothers and Sisters,

We are going to be opening up some here at Holy Family: 1. Drive through confessions. Upcoming times: Sat., May 23rd from 3:30pm - 4:45pm. We'll have two priests. Upcoming dates will also be Wed., May 27th from 7pm-8:30pm and Sat., May 30th from 3:30pm-4:45pm.

- 2. The Oratory will be opening up at 9am on Tues., May 26th. Current signed-up adorers will be sent a sign-up genius to sign up again for new time slots where they are alone or they are with a group they were quarantined with. ALL OTHER PARISHIONERS, IF YOU WANT TO ŚIGN UP **FOR** THE ORATORY, please to www.holyfamilychurch.com and scroll down to the "adoration" icon and click on it and follow the instructions to sign up as a SUBSTITUTE and someone will contact you to instruct you on all the ways we are making this ministry safe through disinfecting after each person, etc. If you have questions please call the parish office at 410-269-0586 and leave a message with extension 21 and your questions will be forwarded to the Adoration leadership.
- 3. The MAIN CHURCH will be open for prayer from 11am 1pm, Monday through Friday beginning Tues., May 26th. Please know there will be a limit on how many people can be in the Church (since it is contiguous with the offices, 5 people at a time). Just go to the parish office entrance and please know you might need to wait a few minutes if the Church is full, (social distancing) and those in the Church need to be informed that others are waiting.
- 4. We now can have weddings, baptisms and funerals in our Church as long as we don't go over 10 people

AS FOR MASS HERE AT HOLY FAMILY: We are waiting for the okay from Anne Arundel County, and we don't know when that will be...but right now, we have looked at the many, many issues that are entailed in making Mass IN the Church building safe. Archdiocese wants only 30% capacity in the Church -- which means only 125 people. So, we would need overflow in the hall where they would simply watch a livestream of the Mass. Restaurant-style individual seating of people by ushers at all entrances, the need to clean thoroughly after every Mass, the need to provide masks for all people entering the building if they don't have them or they are turned away, the need to regulate use of rest rooms and the need to clean the bathrooms after each and every use, etc., etc. The list goes on!

SO, WE HAVE DECIDED, FOR NOW, THAT WE WILL HAVE MASS OUTSIDE IN THE BACK LOT. PEOPLE WOULD NEED TO BRING CHAIRS AND PARK OUT BACK. WE WOULD HAVE PEOPLE HELP YOU SEE WHERE TO PARK. IF THE WEATHER WAS BAD YOU MIGHT NEED TO RETREAT TO YOUR CAR.

THERE WILL BE STRONG WI-FI TO FOLLOW THE MASS FROM YOUR PHONE. AND SPEAKERS FOR THOSE WITHOUT CELL PHONES TO PARK UP FRONT. But for those without cell phones....please try to borrow a cell phone for these parking lot Masses. I'll say Mass under a tent on the back balcony. With this method, no limit on attendees, no cleaning up after Mass. You are safe with your family sitting on your own chairs outside.

We will also **CONTINUE TO LIVESTREAM MASS** and to encourage people who may have compromised immune systems to know that they have dispensation from the Church to watch Mass on Livestream only.

MORE ON THAT LATER with more information on how we will handle singing, getting communion and any kind of collection.

IN the meantime....let's remember our blessings and that Jesus loves us and that the saints are praying for us. Frankly, I love you too and feel so very blessed to be in our parish. I know Deacon Doug and Deacon Moise and the whole staff feel the same way. **THANK YOU** for the extraordinary response you have made to the on-line offerings we have had....it's been amazing.

Peace to you!!!! WHILE I AM AT IT, WE ARE GETTING A BALTIMORE SEMINARIAN FOR THE SUMMER. He begins June 7th. His name is Tre Bart. We are very happy to welcome him.

Other items requested are boxed macaroni & cheese, cereal, medium bags of rice and canned fruit. Small to medium size items are better and plastic containers whenever possible is appreciated. Due to the high demand for donations we have decided to put our blue grocery carts at the main Church entrances (top of the horseshoe driveway) 24 hours a day (weather allowing and times subject to change). STEWARDSHIP: Offertory donations are essential for Holy Family's parish operations. We rely heavily on the Sunday offertory to maintain operational budgets, and fund staff positions and outreach

activities in our community. Many of you have asked how to continue your support while you are unable to attend Mass in person. Holy Family uses Faith Direct to facilitate electronic giving directly to the parish accounts. If you are not already enrolled in Faith Direct you can use this link https://membership.faithdirect.net/MD61 or use the link on the Holy Family website. You can join Faith Direct, using the Holy Family code of MD61 and make a one time or recurring donation from either your checking account or credit card. Options for giving include Offertory, Second Collection and special collections, such as Easter. Those of you who are already enrolled in Faith Direct can also use these links to increase your recurring donations if you believe that you are able to do this. Other options for supporting your parish include setting up your offertory donation through your personal online banking bill pay function. You may also mail your offertory envelopes to the Church office at Holy Family, PO Box 130, Davidsonville, MD 21035. If you have any questions or concerns, you may contact Donna at office@hfccmail.org.

PARISHIONERS 70½ YEARS AND OLDER: Please remember that if you choose to make a charitable distribution from your traditional IRA account, Holy Family is qualified to receive such a distribution under applicable tax law. There are specific tax advantages for those over 70 and ½ years of age who choose to make these types of charitable donations. The donation must be made directly to the qualified charity and Holy Family will acknowledge each charitable donation in writing as required by tax law. You should of course consult your tax advisor before making a federally tax-free charitable distribution from your IRA.



STOCK DONATIONS TO HOLY FAMILY: Donating appreciated stock is an efficient way to make a charitable gift. It's easy and it saves the donor from paying capital gains taxes. If you itemize your

deductions you are eligible to deduct the full fair market value of the stock, up to IRS limits. With the stock market near all time highs, utilizing appreciated stock for charitable gifting is worth considering. Effectively you're able to contribute 20% more than if you sold the stock and paid capital gains taxes. DEACON DOUG'S Q & A: Question: The Covid 19 pandemic has forced postponement of the Baptisms, receptions into the Church, and Confirmation of this year's catechumens (Baptism) and candidates (Confirmation). When did the Church begin RCIA (Rite of Christian Initiation for Adults)?

Answer to question about Pentecost: Pentecost means 50th Day. After the Resurrection, the Apostles were gathered in Jerusalem on this Jewish feast when the Holy Spirit descended upon them. Jewish law required adult Jewish men to come to Jerusalem for the wheat harvest celebration of fifty days after the barley harvest, known as Feast of First Fruits. Pilgrims came from every point of the compass to celebrate the goodness of God and the bringing in of the wheat harvest. Pentecost is another example of the integration of Jewish tradition into Catholic practice.
