Dear Brothers and Sisters.

With the volatile and quickly changing situation we are trying to deal with in how we will be worshipping together and a dozen other issues, it was hard for me to put any information about our schedule. So, I will just write about the Feast Day for this weekend: Pentecost.

We finish our Holy Spirit Novena today. We think about how we are a people who have the presence of God among us. Jesus told us that He would be with us in the Holy Eucharist, in the midst of the Church, in sacraments, in praver, when we tried to love one another and to help those in need.

Indeed, Jesus told us that if we keep His commandments, He will "send the Advocate, the Holy Spirit" to be with you. Since the very first Pentecost, where the Holy Spirit, indeed, touched the early Christians when "they were all gathered in one place," we have known that the Spirit of God is with us not only as an individual when we pray, but as a community of faith, guided by the Spirit.

On this day, maybe we can turn to God and ask the Spirit of God to come into our hearts....and maybe a few times during the day today to ask the Holy Spirit into your heart, saying "Come Holy Spirit into my heart."

We will CONTINUE TO LIVESTREAM MASS and to encourage people who may have compromised immune systems to know that they have dispensation from the Church to watch Mass on Livestream only.

MORE ON THAT LATER with more information on how we will handle singing, getting communion and any kind of collection.

IN the meantime....let's remember our blessings and that Jesus loves us and that the saints are praying for us. Frankly, I love you too and feel so very blessed to be in our parish. I know Deacon Doug and Deacon Moise and the whole staff feel the same way. THANK YOU for the extraordinary response you have made to the on-line offerings we have had it's been amazing.

LAST BUT NOT LEAST, WE ARE GETTING A BALTIMORE SEMINARIAN FOR THE SUMMER. He begins June 7th. His name is Tre Bart. We are very happy to welcome him.

You can join Faith Direct, using the Holy Family code of MD61 and make a one time or recurring donation from either your checking account or credit card. Options for giving include Offertory, Second Collection and special collections, such as Easter. Those of you who are already enrolled in Faith Direct can also use these links to increase your recurring donations if you believe that you are able to do this. Other options for supporting your parish include setting up your offertory donation through your personal online banking bill pay function. You may also mail your offertory envelopes to the Church office at Holy Family, PO Box 130, Davidsonville, MD 21035. PARISHIONERS 701/2 YEARS AND OLDER: Please remember that if you choose to make a charitable distribution from your traditional IRA account, Holy Family is qualified to receive such a distribution under applicable tax law. There are specific tax advantages for those over 70 and 1/2 years of age who choose to make these types of charitable donations. The donation must be made directly to the qualified charity and Holy Family will acknowledge each charitable donation in writing as required by tax law. You should of course consult your tax advisor before making a federally tax-free charitable distribution from your IRA.



STOCK DONATIONS TO HOLY FAMILY: Donating appreciated stock is an efficient way to make a charitable gift. It's easy and it saves the donor from paying

capital gains taxes. lf you itemize your deductions you are eligible to deduct the full fair market value of the stock, up to IRS limits. With the stock market near all time highs, utilizing appreciated stock for charitable gifting is worth considering. Effectively you're able to contribute 20% more than if you sold the stock and paid capital gains taxes. Tithing vs. Stewardship

Question:

What is the difference between tithing and stewardship?

Answer:

Both tithing and stewardship are part of a spiritual way of life that calls us to use all of our resources for the service of the Gospel. Everything we are and everything we have comes from God. Offering back to God what He has given us is part of how we worship and give thanks to God.

Tithing is the practice of giving back 10 percent of what we earn. It comes from the Old English word for "ten." The first Scriptural example of tithing came from Abraham who gave a tenth of his possessions to the priest Melchizedek. He did so as an act of thanksgiving to God.

Stewardship as a way of life calls us to use well all that we have and all that we are, placing all things in service of others and God. Stewardship helps us see the good we can accomplish by making God and our spiritual life the most important values in our life. Whatever we accumulate in this life stays here. We can't take it with us! Both tithing and stewardship help us remember that nothing is mine or even ours ... all belongs to God.

DEACON DOUG'S Q & A: Question: The Covid 19 pandemic has forced the postponement of the Baptisms, receptions into the Church, and Confirmation of this year's catechumens (Baptism) and candidates (Confirmation). When did the Church begin RCIA (Rite of Christian Initiation for Adults)?

Answer to question about Pentecost: Pentecost means 50th Day. After the Resurrection, the Apostles were gathered in Jerusalem on this Jewish feast when the Holy Spirit descended upon them. Jewish law required adult Jewish men to come to Jerusalem for the wheat harvest celebration of *fifty days* after the barley harvest, known as Feast of First Fruits. Pilgrims came from every point of the compass to celebrate the goodness of God and the bringing in of the wheat harvest. Pentecost is another example of the integration of Jewish tradition into Catholic practice.
