Donating appreciated stock is an efficient way to make a charitable gift. It's easy and it saves the donor from paying capital

gains taxes. If you itemize your deductions you are eligible to deduct the full fair market value of the stock, up to IRS limits. With the stock market near all time highs, utilizing appreciated stock for charitable gifting is worth considering. Effectively you're able to contribute 20% more than if you sold the stock and paid capital gains taxes. CARING FOR CREATION: So, this time of year the newspaper, (yes I read them) radio and the internet are just full of information on how to take care of our lawns. Much of that information suggests using lots of chemicals; herbicides and pesticides. There was a time when most houses were built on

one, two and three acre lots of grass, many here in Davidsonville. Most newer developments have much smaller foot prints. What can we do as faithful stewards of God's creation? Certainly we can plant more native trees and flowers. One of the things that I have done with success is just expanding the size of the flower beds that I already have. Every year while edging the flowerbeds I remove three or four inches of grass to make a fresh edge. The flowerbeds magically grow and the lawn magically shrinks. Mary Ann insists that I leave space for her tomatoes. So, we have three growing in the flowerbeds and one cherry tomato in a pot. Here comes summer!
