On June 4th Khoa Tran (Quah Trahn) arrived here at Holy Family. He is from Vietnam and came here from Saigon only last August. He is studying at the Archdiocese of Baltimore to be a priest. Please keep him in your prayers and offer him a warm welcome. If you want to say "welcome" to him in Vietnamese say "chào mừng" (chow moong).

This Sunday, June 6th, following the 11:15am Masses in the Church and outside we will have a procession for Corpus Christi/Feast of the Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ. We will process from the back balcony over to the Chapel and then around the campus. Those attending Mass in the Church on Sunday are also invited to join in our procession as well as those who attended other Masses that weekend or watched virtually. We will have a short time of Adoration on the lawn in front of the Church where the traffic circle is for people to pray outside on that day.

This year, for the first time, we are using a *CANOPY* over the Monstrance held by four people as we walk made by Mr. Gerry Coffman and Sew Time for the procession. It is an old tradition to do this.

Next Sunday, June 13th, we will be having a "going away" Mass for myself at the 11:15am OUTSIDE Mass. We are asking those who would like to stick around after the Mass to pack a cooler and have your own lunch and the parish will provide beverages and cookies.

Then I'll meander around the back lot chatting with all the families there and thanking them for all the good things we have experienced in the last 11 years.

Please know that you all have meant a lot to me these past years. I thought to myself the other day what a different perspective I have from 11 years. So many great people that have touched my life.

Thank you for that and if you can make it, please come on June 13th.

deductions you are eligible to deduct the full fair market value of the stock, up to IRS limits. With the stock market near all time highs, utilizing appreciated stock for charitable gifting is worth considering. Effectively you're able to contribute 20% more than if you sold the stock and paid capital gains taxes. CARING FOR CREATION MINISTRY: Storm water Ponds Part 2. Thank you all for your donations, so far. Still a few more opportunities are available. There are some native wild flowers growing now including Dogbane, a

milkweed and Frost Asters that will bloom very soon. During the summer we see birds, butterflies and bees visiting the area. So, the operative word is some. I have already begun to introduce some more diversity to the ponds. If anyone wants to bring some native only flowers, I am thinking Butterfly Milkweed, Coneflower and Black-eyed Susan, we can certainly find a place for them and maybe there is a place in your own landscape. By the way, Butterfly Bush is not a native, but imported from the far east and is an invasive species. You can plant your native flowers or if you really want me too, leave them at the office and I will ask the youth group to plant them for you. Finally, we have cicadas at our house. They are just fascinating!
