DEACON DOUG'S Q & A: In addition to water, what are the other symbols used in Baptism?

Answer to the question about levels of celebrations in the Church calendar: The three levels of importance are: Feast Days that commemorate the astonishing actions of the Savior God, like the Annunciation. A Memorial is a lower-ranked feast day in honor of a saint, the dedication of a Church, or a mystery of the religion. E.g. June 28, St Irenaeus, a Father of the Church. A solemnity is the highest rank celebrating a mystery of faith such as the Trinity, an event in the life of Jesus or Mary and Joseph, or another important saint. E.g. today, June 19th, Corpus Christi.

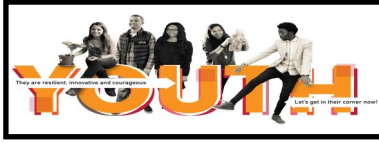
