~ Pastor's Note ~

I thank you for your prayers for me and my brother priests during our recent retreat. The retreat provided us with an opportunity to catch up with one another and to pray together. Some sixty plus priests attended the five day long retreat held at St. Mary's Seminary in Baltimore.

The Retreat Director was Rev. Jacque Philippe, a French born priest and a member of The Community of the Beatitudes. The theme of the retreat centered on that a priest should be a true father, caring for members of the Church community, loving them where they are on their journey in life.

Speaking on prayer, Fr. Jacque said that we often focus on the results of our prayer and become discouraged because of "the poverty of our prayer." He suggested that we take a step back and see our prayer first as a fundamental openness to God and a resting in God's presence.

Archbishop Lori ordained eight new priests for service to our Archdiocese on Saturday, June 24th at a full Cathedral of Mary Our Queen. The Cathedral seats 1,800 people. It was a three hour long joyful ordination!

One of the Ordinandi was Rev. Felix Mmuoh. I met him four years ago during his summer assignment at St. Ignatius of Loyola Parish and who is now my brother priest and friend. Last Sunday, I was blessed to participate in Fr. Felix's joyful first Mass at St. Claire Parish in Essex.

Please pray for the newly ordained priests as they begin their ministry here in our Archdiocese and for the priests beginning new assignments in this month of July. Pray also for our seminarians during their summer assignments and for all who are discerning their vocation to the ordained priesthood.

I share with you an update on our HVAC Campaign. As of this past Sunday, June 25th, we have received \$81,344.12. These gifts, combined with the \$50,000 from our reserve fund, gives us a total of \$131,344.12 or 21% towards our goal of \$630,000! We are tracking our parish's progress in our HVAC Campaign with the two red thermometers in our narthex. The thermometers are on the two brick walls on the far right or left of the double doors that lead into our Church.

Every dollar given during this two year campaign is cathedraticum free, which means every dollar will go toward the purchase and installation of our new HVAC System. If you would like to make your contribution thru Faith Direct, you can contribute to the maintenance collection on Faith Direct. If you would like assistance in choosing this option for the campaign, feel free to call the Parish Office. Thank you for your support!

We are starting our summer Mass schedule this weekend, July 1st & 2nd thru August 26th & 27th. The Mass schedule will be as follows: Saturday Vigil Mass - 5pm, Sunday Masses - 8:30am & 10:30am. On the first weekend in September we will return to our regular Mass schedule.

At the start of the Covid Pandemic, the sharing of the Precious Blood of Jesus Christ was stopped. This weekend, July 1st & 2nd, communion will be offered under both species, the Body and the Blood of Jesus Christ. If you have a cold or are feeling under the weather, I would ask you to not receive from the chalice.

CARING FOR CREATION: Sophie knows something is going on in the nursery (pictured below). Eastern (Sialia scalia) Bluebirds are cavity nesters. With so many of us cleaning up dead trees all the time, there's a limited number of trees for them to nest in. Fifty years ago Bluebirds were in serious decline. Nesting boxes such as these help solve that problem.

For those of you inclined, there are many plans on-line to build nesting boxes yourself and they are available in stores as well. I would be glad to help you install one. Bluebirds will have up to three broods a year up thru late August so it's not too late. Did you know there are eight nesting boxes here at Holy Family?

Cleaning out old nests is important as insects will take over the nesting box, eating all the detritus from the previous brood. Not to worry, the Bluebirds will build a new one. Search for bluebird songs and you will probably find that you hear them in your nature-scape already. There is an app for that.

Please don't forget the snacks for kids that go with the grocery bags from OLPH and Mt. Zion **BREAKFAST CLUB** Interfaith Ministry. We deliver food directly to those in need. Blessing for everything you all do.


OUR DAILY BREAD CASSEROLES
