CARING FOR CREATION: It's a warm and sunny afternoon as I stroll thru the garden admiring all the tomato plants that are now 5 feet tall. There are green tomatoes everywhere including Cherry, Heirloom and Big Boy I think,

and perhaps something else as well. One other thing I noticed was all the bees. Interestingly, the small solitary bees and big ol' Bumble Bees are all over the native Coneflowers, Black Eyed Susan's and Milkweed flowers in the garden. They are going from flower to flower. Did you know the Bumble Bees pollenate tomato flowers through "buzz pollination" shaking the flowers allowing the tomatoes to self fertilize. A good reason to have the flowers and tomatoes coexisting together.

The lovely wife insisted on planting a bunch of **Dahlias and Zinnias**. They add a nice flash of color along the border of the garden. Sort of a understory flower to help define the space. Interestingly as well is there is there is not a single bee on any of those flowers. So, Zinnias are native to North America and the Dahlias are native to Central and South America. Perhaps the flowers are not quite **"ready"** for the bees yet. We will have to wait and see. Watch this space.

As a reminder the Mosquitoes are coming out in great numbers at this time of year. Check the saucers of any plants you may have purchased or brought outside and dump out the excess water. In a matter of days, eggs laid in standing water will hatch and fresh warrior will emerge and will be ready to suck your blood. Other places they breed are birdbaths, so change that water every couple of days. Clogged gutters provide habitat all around your house. Last year I installed gutter guards so at least that is no longer a problem, Those Rain Gardens at the front of the Church are specifically designed to empty within 24 hours to prevent mosquitoes from hatching there. I try to take a moment and see God's splendor everywhere around us. You can too.

They do not imply agreement with the contents, opinions or statements expressed.
