DEACON DOUG'S Q & A: What is the difference between a sacrament and a sacramental?

Answer to last week's question about the Council of Nicea as "The Gettysburg of Christianity": Nicea (325 AD) was the first Ecumenical Council held after the official

toleration of Christianity by the new Emperor Constantine. Attended by bishops from throughout the empire, many who had suffered during a recent violent persecution, it resolved the very serious issue of the divinity of Christ, which had been denied by very powerful heretical force known as Arianism. If the Arians had won, Christianity would have eventually been reduced to a philosophy, the faith today defined by the Nicene Creed (which we pray every Sunday).
