#### STOCK DONATIONS TO HOLY

**FAMILY:** Donating appreciated stock is an efficient way to make a charitable gift. It's easy and it saves the donor from paying capital gains taxes. If you itemize your

deductions you are eligible to deduct the full fair market value of the stock, up to IRS limits. With the stock market near all time highs, utilizing appreciated stock for charitable gifting is worth considering. Effectively you're able to contribute 20% more than if you sold the stock and paid capital gains taxes. **CARING FOR CREATION**: I got an urgent call from my friend, Ron. It seems a bird has built a nest in his gas grill. Moreover, there are three little eggs in the nest. What to do? I ask him if you can send me a couple pictures, which he does. Turns out this little bird is a Carolina Wren, and

it just so happens to be my favorite bird. They are not afraid of humans, for the most part and like to build their nests near homes and human made shelter.

It's the male wren that does all the singing and I hear him all Summer long. What a treat. A breeding pair mates for life and one bird was captured nearly nine years after it was originally banded. No wonder they seem to come back every year. It's the same ones! Outside my basement door, under the deck a pair nests every year. They hoot and holler every time we let the dogs out that door. I love it.

Oh, back to my friend Ron. So, incubation is about 12 days and the hatchlings stay in the nest for a couple weeks after that. No hot dogs, no chicken, no hamburgers on the grill for a month. The mom and dad are flying under and up into the grill from the bottom bringing insects and seeds to the babies. When these nestlings leave the nest in a couple weeks, I suggested Ron use a cover on the grill from now on. There are often two broods per year for a breeding pair. They will be back!

**DEACON DOUG'S Q & A:** *Question*: Where did the first priests for Holy Family come from?

Answer to last week's question: Ground for the current Church was broken in June, 1989 and dedication was in June 1991. The Chapel was dedicated on September 29, 1929. (Side note, the chapel was built from a Sears kit. Sears had a kit for Churches similar to the several thousand individual home kits Sears produced from 1908 to 1940). And, no, the Chapel was not the first parish Church. Masses were held at Dodon, the country home of the Steuart Family from 1890 until 1929. A section of the house is still visible on the grounds of what is now the Dodon winery.

Author's note: In the three years since this little corner began, the parish has grown considerably. So, for the sake of so many of you new members, and for the older folks like myself whose memories may not be as sharp as we would like, we will return to the first questions about parish history. Holy Family is a remarkable "country parish" and knowing more about its rich history will help to deepen our own faith through an appreciation of how the Holy Spirit worked through those who built and sustained it through the early years.


