Caring for Creation sometimes has a few surprises for us in the landscape. Right now, most of us have seen the dead branch tips on some of our trees, particularly the oaks trees. What has happened is our friendly Lady Cicadas were busy

laying eggs a while back on those small branch tips. You remember them flying around and making all that noise, right? Each female can lay up to 500 eggs. So, they are hatching now and will begin raining down on us. If you see any, they are white and much smaller than a grain of rice and those red eyes they are there too. The successful ones will fall on the ground and begin tunneling down to the tree root system. The **Cicadas** will begin to feed and go through 5 molting cycles during the next 17 years. The **Cicadas** evolved with our trees and will survive this cycle. They do a great favor turning and aerating the soil allowing water to flow down to the root system. As for those brown tips, you can clip them off and drop in your recycle bin if you want to be tidy. If they are too high in the canopy just wait, they will all come down naturally. Looking forward to seeing them again in 2038, you?

DEACON DOUG'S Q & A: *Question*: Holy Family is only one of three parishes in South County. Historically what has been its relation to Our Lady of Perpetual Help and Our Lady of Sorrows?

Answer to last week's question about whether the Parish ever had a school? With the exception of the short lived Marist seminary at Dodon, Holy Family never had a school. Religious sisters, however, did come regularly to Holy Family to teach religious ed classes: first the Sisters from Mission Helpers in 1920 and then the Sisters of Notre Dame who came in 1947.

Author's note: In the three years since this little corner began, the parish has grown considerably. So, for the sake of so many of you new members, and for the older folks like myself whose memories may not be as sharp as we would like, we will return to the first questions about parish history. Holy Family is a remarkable "country parish" and knowing more about its rich history will help to deepen our own faith through an appreciation of how the Holy Spirit worked through those who built and sustained it through the early years.


