Dear Brothers & Sisters,

Here at Holy Family we certainly want everyone to follow their own hearts about keeping themselves safe in the midst of the pandemic. At the same time, please know that we, in our parish, are doing everything we can to make sure that we are a safe place for you to come to to celebrate Mass.

We clean and disinfect our Church/hall after every Mass. We are diligent about wearing masks. We have set up a procedure for seating, entering/exiting the building, liturgical celebration and using our facilities that does all that is possible to minimize the possibility of spreading Covid-19.

So, we just wanted you to know that. If you are still concerned that you might take the option of coming to an **OUTDOOR MASS** (11:15am every Sunday until it gets to be too cold) or even sitting in the **NARTHEX** during a church Mass or sitting in the JMJ Cafe area (the lobby off of Unity Hall) during a Mass.

Just wanted you to know what we are doing here at Holy Family and how you also might avail yourself of options that would help you feel secure during weekend Masses.

Please be aware of a few things:

- ◆ Religious education classes start Sept. 20-21. Even at this late date you can sign your kids for **EITHER** virtual or in-person classes but you may have to accept the times they offer you since some time slots may be filled up. Just go to holyfamilychurch.com and scroll down to the image "**Faith Formation.**" Please know that we have scholarship money available if money is an issue.
- ◆ For students in the second grade, please remember to sign them up for First Reconciliation prep classes. Please contact Shannon at shanpaynewishes@gmail.com.
- ◆ For students in the 9th grade, please remember to sign them up for Confirmation. Registration for Confirmation 2021 is online! For details, visit the Confirmation page of our parish website at <https://www.holyfamilychurch.com/confirmation.html>. Please register your children by Tuesday, September 22.
- ◆ There are also many adult ed. programs that have just started, and it's not too late to still sign up. Please check the website, bulletin and a mailing we have sent out (through snail mail), which you can also find on the website by scrolling down on the home page.

FINALLY, A WORD ABOUT THE DIGNITY OF LIFE FROM TWO DIFFERENT PERSPECTIVES: This weekend, our parish will remember the dignity of human life through two events: One promoting an alternative to abortion and the other through discussing the issue of racism.

1. We'll have a walk to support an alternative to abortion through supporting the Pregnancy Center in Annapolis (Sept 19). Walkers and runners are participating from Holy Family. The donation must be made directly to the qualified charity and Holy Family will acknowledge each charitable donation in writing as required by tax law. **You should of course consult your tax advisor before making a federally tax-free charitable distribution from your IRA.**



STOCK DONATIONS TO HOLY FAMILY: Donating appreciated stock is an efficient way to make a charitable gift. It's easy and it saves the donor from paying capital gains taxes. If you itemize your deductions you are eligible to deduct the full fair market value of the stock, up to IRS limits. With the stock market near all time highs, utilizing appreciated stock for charitable gifting is worth considering. Effectively you're able to contribute 20% more than if you sold the stock and paid capital gains taxes. CARING FOR CREATION MINISTRY:

Did You Know Preying Mantis are laying eggs now? I remember last year, I was in a local garden center looking at all the plants and there was a momma with a very big fat belly on a branch upside down. You can see

pictures on the Caring For Creation page under Ministries at our web site. The next day she laid hundreds of eggs and made a protective small case. It looked like a walnut growing around the branch. This is a good time to remember why we grow native plants and flowers. Nymphs hatchlings look much like tiny versions of their parents. Moths, crickets, grasshoppers, flies, and other insects are the usual food of these carnivores. I have even seen them sitting on a flower and grab a big bumble bee right out of the air. The female sometimes eats her mate just after, or even during mating. Hmm... This behavior seems to not deter males from reproduction. Double Hmm... Goldfinches are busy right now eating seeds on Black Eyed Susan's, the Maryland State Flower. Cone flowers will continue to provide nectar for a while, before they turn to seed with the help of our bee and butterfly pollinators.

Please remember the St Vincent de Paul poor box this weekend and the food pantry at OLPH. The blue grocery carts, located outside the front entrance of the Church, are always available for your food and personal care donations. Can you bring something each week? The food pantry has plenty of peanut butter and jelly for now. Paper products are appreciated. Please remember smaller packages are always better.
