DEACON DOUG'S Q & A: For Baptisms in the Catholic Church, must the godparents be Catholic?

Answer to the question about what historical event led to the Church declaration that October is the Month of the Rosary: The Battle of Lepanto in 1571 was an historical naval defeat of the Turkish Ottoman Empire by Catholic forces in the Mediterranean that saved Europe from the Ottoman threat. Before the battle Pope Pius V had urged all Europeans to pray the rosary. Since the victory was attributed to the rosary, October shortly thereafter was dedicated to the rosary.

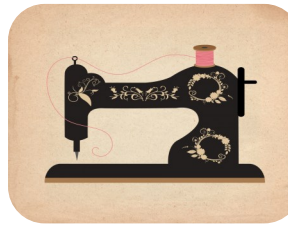
