Right now our needs are cereal, canned chicken, tuna, peanut butter (18oz. not the large jars), pull top ready to eat soup and stews, ravioli, Spaghetti O's, baked beans, canned fruit/ fruit cups (any variety), mustard, ketchup, mayonnaise (14oz. preferably plastic containers), spaghetti sauce and noodles, baked beans, crackers, cookies, ramen noodles, pancake mix & syrup, mac-n-cheese (individual cups), salt, pepper (small containers), flour & sugar (1lb) paper products, and Ziploc bags.

**DEACON DOUG'S Q & A:** Many volunteers in the parish take what is known as Virtus training. What is it?

Answer to the question about the small round container for the Eucharist: It is called a Pyx. The word "pyx" comes from the Greek word, "pyxis," meaning box or receptacle. It is a round cylinder sometimes used in the early Church to

contain the Eucharist on the altar, like the tabernacle today. In more recent times it is small enough to contain one or a small number of hosts to be taken and shared with the sick and shut-ins.
