In regards to Masses, we continue to celebrate an outdoor Mass on Sundays at 11:15am. So far, we have been blessed with good weather on these Sundays. Last Sunday, October 31st, we had 300 persons in attendance, making this our largest attended Mass. We continue to livestream our Saturday, 5pm Vigil Mass and our 9am Daily Mass Tuesday thru Friday.

You may recall in last week's bulletin I wrote of the forthcoming Church Synod or Synodality, that is how the Church accompanies disciples on their journey in following the Lord Jesus. The Parish staff and I have been meeting and working together on the format and dates we will hold our listening sessions. The goal of the Synod is to review and improve the ways we support you, the parishioners on your faith journey. We also hope to identify new ways/methods of supporting parishioners. We are planning several ways to receive input from you. One opportunity for you to participate will be a Town Hall style meeting here on Thursday, November 18th at 7:30pm in Unity Hall.

More information will be shared with you as the Parish Staff completes its planning for our local Synod. If you would like to read more about the Synod, google Vatican Preparatory Document. Once again, please pray for the Holy Spirit's guidance as we plan for our local Synod.

This past Tuesday we celebrated All Soul's Day. Throughout this month of November, we remember our deceased loved ones in the Book of Remembrance which is located in front of the Easter candle by the Baptismal Font in the Church. WINTER RELIEF: This year, we will host up to 25 guests during the week of November 29th to December 6th, with setup of Unity Hall on Sunday, November 28th. This program, which is coordinated by the Arundel House of Hope and operates with the help of Churches and Synagogues throughout Anne Arundel County, allows us to house and serve meals to homeless persons for a one-week period during cold weather months. Because of COVID we were unable to host last year. To keep everyone as safe as possible this year, we are requiring that all volunteers and guests be vaccinated. As in the past, volunteers who will have contact with our guests must have had the brief but important Virtus training. Volunteers may check with Louisa Woolery to see if past training needs to be updated. Please consider signing up today to volunteer. You may do so by going to the Holy Family website and clicking on the Winter Relief icon. That will lead you to the link for SignUpGenius. There are many opportunities to serve, including donating food and other supplies needed for the week. Vaccinations are not required if you are simply delivering food to Unity Hall in advance of the hosting times. There will be a Sign Up Weekend on November 13th-14th. Volunteers may sign up in the Upper Gallery after every Mass. CARING FOR CREATION means you. So, one of our parishioners, asked me to talk about an invasive plant called porcelain berry. Interestingly this is a great time of year to talk about it because this plant looks identical to our native grape ivy which grows naturally in our forests. The fruit is easy to identify with its multi colored fruits. Porcelain berry likes exactly the same habitat as our native grape. The difference is that it emerges earlier in the Spring, will grow much faster and grow much taller than the grape cousin. In fact, it grows so fast that it can smother and kill mature trees in a few years. So, feel free to search your woodlands and cut it down at ground level. In the photo above, we are replanting native shrubs after removing all the invasives and trees smothered by them, behind the old post office building a few years ago.

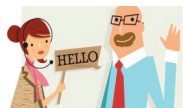

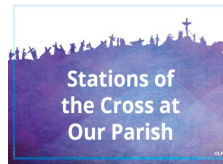
