Dear Brothers & Sisters,

This weekend, in honor of Veteran's Day on we will have a display of military uniforms in the front of the Church.

At all the Masses (Church, Unity Hall and weather cooperating, outside) we will have St. Michael's medals to give to veterans and all in the military. With all the concerns about Covid we will have a blessing prayer for the veterans/military during Mass and then the medals will be near the altar (whether Mass is in the Church/Unity Hall/outside) spaced out so that they can be taken by each person safely.

In the readings today we hear Jesus tell us a story about *USING OUR GIFTS* towards the greater good. Sometimes we might not know *HOW* to be a part of "building up the Kingdom of God" in this world....but if that is the case, let's remember St. Teresa of the Little Flower and Mother Teresa of Calcutta, who both often spoke of doing "small things with great love." We just try to bring the love of God to those around us in simple ways.

Of course, there are larger issues out there in society and sometimes we have to think about how to be a part of those solutions (sponsoring a child overseas? Advocating for an issue of importance in our society?) and we should pray about those kinds of actions as well.

But as we think about *USING OUR GIFTS* let's remember also that all can go awry if we are not staying in touch with the *GIVER OF THE GIFTS* through prayer and having an attitude of thankfulness, etc. I have met too many people lately who have found themselves neglecting prayer and feeling all out-of-sorts because they have been focusing on the hot-button news items out there, and they have not been praying.....Or they have been focusing on the problems out there (the quarantine, etc.) and not on the blessings they have and not on Jesus.

So, let's fix our eyes on Jesus and think about what blessings we do have, so that God's peace can touch our hearts to give us **ENERGY** to **GIVE OUR GIFTS** towards the building up of the Kingdom of God in the world.

PARISHIONERS 70½ YEARS AND OLDER: Please remember that if you choose to make a charitable distribution from your traditional IRA account, Holy Family is qualified to receive such a distribution under applicable tax law. There are specific tax advantages for those over 70 and ½ years of age who choose to make these types of charitable donations. The donation must be made directly to the qualified charity and Holy Family will acknowledge each charitable donation in writing as required by tax law. You should of course consult your tax advisor before making a federally tax-free charitable distribution from your IRA.



STEWARDSHIP: Offertory donations are essential for Holy Family's parish operations. We rely heavily on the Sunday offertory to maintain operational budgets, and fund staff positions and outreach

activities in our community. Many of you have asked how to continue your support while you are unable to attend Mass in person. Holy Family uses Faith Direct to facilitate electronic giving directly to the parish accounts. If you are not already enrolled in Faith Direct you can use this link https:// membership.faithdirect.net/MD61 or use the link on the Holy Family website. You can join Faith Direct, using the Holy Family code of MD61 and make a one time or recurring donation from either your checking account or credit card. Options for giving include Offertory, Second Collection and special collections, such as Easter. Those of you who are already enrolled in Faith Direct can also use these links to increase your recurring donations if you believe that you are able to do this. Other options for supporting your parish include setting up your offertory donation through your personal online banking bill pay function. You may also mail your offertory envelopes to the Church office at Holy Family, PO Box 130, Davidsonville, MD 21035. DEACON DOUG'S Q & A: *Question:* Who is referred to in Catholic teaching as "Theotokos?"

Answer to last week's question about the difference between homily

and sermon: While many consider the two to be the same, a homily is commentary delivered by a priest or deacon based on the Scripture readings, usually at Mass. A sermon is a speech or discourse on religion or morals not necessarily related to Scripture and may be offered outside of religious services. Sermon is derived from the Latin word sermonem which means speech or discourse, while homily is derived from the Greek word homilia, which means conversation. The difference was noted as early as the 3rd Century when the emphasis of homilies was on community.
