Please join me in welcoming Lisa Delgado as the new Religious Education Office Assistant. Lisa will be supporting both the Faith Formation and Sacramental Preparation ministries.

Having begun the New Church Year with the beginning of Advent, we will begin reading from the Gospel of Matthew (Cycle A Readings). Matthew's Gospel is divided into five books. These five books are preceded by the story of the Infancy Narrative and followed by Jesus' Passion. Matthew's Gospel highlights Jesus as the teacher and develops the theme of the **"Kingdom of Heaven."** Matthew, writing for Jewish Christians, makes a special point of demonstrating, by the use of Old Testament quotations, that the scriptures are being fulfilled in the person of and the work of Jesus, who is the teacher and interpreter of the Jewish scriptures and law.

Winter Relief is a joint effort of Christian Churches in Anne Arundel County working together to provide safe and warm overnight housing during the colder months of the year, an evening meal, breakfast, lunch and transportation for our brothers and sisters who at this time do not have permanent housing.

This year our Parish's participation in Winter Relief begins Monday, November 28th and continues through the morning of Monday, December 5th.

Please keep in your prayers our guests this coming week and the many Holy Family parishioners who will be serving during Winter Relief.

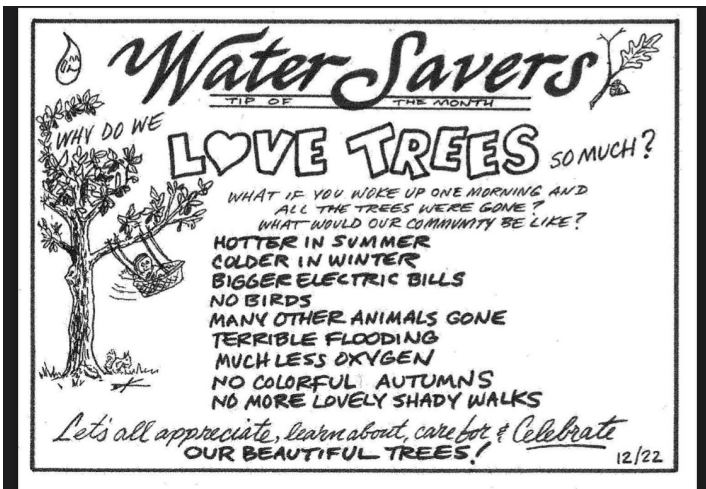

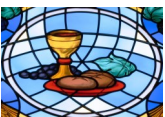

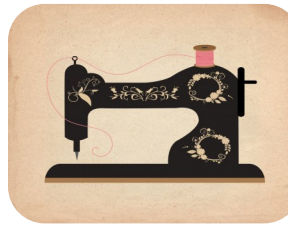
