~ Pastor's Note ~

I have good news to share with you! The new audio speakers and audio music improvements for our Church will be installed Monday and Tuesday, December 19th and 20th. To allow the workers to do their work, Daily Mass on this coming Tuesday, December 20th, will be celebrated in the Chapel. The Sacrament of Reconciliation which is scheduled for that same Tuesday starting at 10am will be in the sacristy of the Chapel.

As I wrote last week, I have been thinking of the future of our parish and wondering what our parish will be like in say three years time. Envisioning and planning for our future as a parish community, we are beginning to formulate a Parish Strategic Plan which will help us to look at where we are as a parish community now, identify the needs of our parish and what we want our parish community to look like in three to five years time. A Strategic Plan encompasses more than a Master Plan which looks primarily at a parish's needs in regards to buildings and parking. In formulating our Strategic Plan, we look at all aspects of our parish including our culture; our worship; our service; our hospitality; all aspects of communication within our parish and outside our parish; our physical plant, including the future uses of the old Post Office building and our campus and many more aspects of parish life. We are beginning a multi-year effort to create a Parish Strategic Plan. I will be sharing more details with you as we begin this promising new chapter in our parish's life. For now, I ask for your prayers as we begin this process and begin to dream and envision what we would like our parish to become making us even more vibrant as Disciples for Christ in the years to come.

The schedule of Masses for Christmas and the Solemnity of Mary, the Holy Mother of God, can be found in this bulletin (pg. 3 rt. Column), on our website, and in the Friday Blast. At the end of November, we mailed a post card with the schedule of the Christmas Masses to all registered parishioners.

What are you going to be doing on Saturday, February 4, 2023? On that Saturday, The Annual Polar Bear Plunge is going to be taking place on the Western Shore of the Chesapeake Bay at Sandy Point State Park from 11am-4pm.The Polar Bear Plunge is when Marylanders will plunge into the waters of the Chesapeake Bay, raising money for the Maryland Special Olympics which allows our fellow Marylanders to participate in many Olympic sports.

I have never participated in this event, never really thought of participating but this coming year I am going to do the plunge. I invite Holy Family parishioners to join me in this annual charity event. I especially challenge the men of our parish, including our teenagers, to join me.



DEACON DOUG'S Q & A: What are the three different Masses at Christmas?

Answer to the question about Santa Claus and a Christian saint: Santa Claus can be traced back to St. Nicholas whose

Feast Day is December 6th. He lived around 300 AD in what is today modern-day Turkey. He became the subject of many legends giving away all his inherited wealth to help the poor and sick. The best-known story is how he saved three poor sisters from being sold into slavery by their father by throwing a bag of gold coins through a window, providing them with a dowry so that they could be married. By the Renaissance, St. Nicholas was the most popular saint in Europe.
