#### Dear Brothers & Sisters,

- 1. Be a light this Advent Season. Help us "make a bed for Baby Jesus" like the straws of Bethlehem so many years ago. Mangers where you can place your good deeds written on yellow slips of paper will be in the JMJ Café, as you enter UNITY HALL for Mass and also in the Narthex, as you enter the CHURCH for Mass.
- 2. We'll be posting, in the flocknote and on the Facebook page, one to three minute long videos about faith and the Advent/ Christmas season through Christmas Day. Some videos will be by myself, Deacon Doug, Deacon Moise, staff members or parishioners. This is just a way to try to make Advent more personal for everyone this year in a less personal environment.
- 3. TWO SEMINARIANS FROM CAMEROON MOVED INTO THE RECTORY ON DEC. 13th: Their names are Shiadrik and Clinton. I am not 100% sure when they will be able to mix with folks in the parish since they arrived from overseas by plane (from Cameroon) on Dec 13th. But I am hoping that you all can see them soon. In January Shiadrik will begin at Mt. St. Mary's in Emmitsburg and Clinton will begin at St. Mary's in Baltimore. Please pray for them, and if you would like to help us in getting them some basic things like warm clothing, bedding for the seminary room, shampoo, a laptop, etc, you can **DONATE TO THE POOR BOX** the weekend of Dec. 19th-20th and those funds will go to helping these two fellows.
- **4. CHRISTMAS SINGALONG ON DEC. 20th**: With the help of Mr. Ron Brown and the choir, we'll have a **VIRTUAL CHRISTMAS SINGALONG** with favorite Advent and Christmas hymns sung and the Christmas Nativity story read, in sections, in between songs. We will be sending out the music to you all to sing with from home on the Facebook and in our email blast. You'll be able to watch this live on Facebook or Youtube.

#### 5. CHRISTMAS EVE AND CHRISTMAS MASSES:

- 1pm & 3pm Masses on Christmas Eve, OUTSIDE (weather permitting), no registration needed. The 1pm Mass will be cancelled if there is precipitation or if the temperatures are below freezing and the 3pm will require registering on line if it's moved inside.
- ◆ The following Masses will require pre-registration: CHRISTMAS EVE - 3pm & 5:30pm Masses in the Church 7:30pm & 10pm in the Church. CHRISTMAS DAY, 10am in the Church. Go to holyfamilychurch.com to register. If you do not do a computer, please call the Parish Office and leave a message for Donna at extension 35. Please do not leave a message for her after noon on Monday Dec. 21st. Any message left after that time will not be answered.
- ♦ We are providing more Masses than normal....and just aren't sure what to expect in terms of attendance this year. BUT, if the Masses become FULL, we have been told by the Archdiocese that JUST FOR CHRISTMAS EVE / and CHRISTMAS THIS YEAR, we can allow people to watch the Mass from their phones in their cars. EVEN IF PEOPLE HAVE NOT REGISTERED, they can come into the Church at communion time and then go back to their car. This also is an option if you simply don't want to come into the building for Mass this Christmas.

**STEWARDSHIP:** Offertory donations are essential for Holy Family's parish operations. We rely heavily on the Sunday offertory to maintain operational budgets, and fund staff positions and outreach activities in our

community. Many of you have asked how to continue your support while you are unable to attend Mass in person. Holy Family uses Faith Direct to facilitate electronic giving directly to the parish accounts. You can join Faith Direct, using the Holy Family code of MD61 and make a one time or recurring donation from either your checking account or credit card. Options for giving include Offertory, Second Collection and special collections, such as Easter. Those of you who are already enrolled in Faith Direct can also use these links to increase your recurring donations if you believe that you are able to do this. Other options for supporting your parish include setting up your offertory donation through your personal online banking bill pay function. You may also mail your offertory envelopes to the Church office at Holy Family, PO Box 130, Davidsonville, MD 21035. STOCK DONATIONS TO HOLY FAMILY: Donating appreciated stock is an efficient way to make a charitable gift. It's easy and it saves the donor from paying capital gains taxes. If you itemize your

deductions you are eligible to deduct the full fair market value of the stock, up to IRS limits. With the stock market near all time highs, utilizing appreciated stock for charitable gifting is worth considering. Effectively you're able to contribute 20% more than if you sold the stock and paid capital gains taxes. PARISHIONERS 70½ YEARS AND OLDER: Please remember that if you choose to make a charitable distribution from your traditional IRA account, Holy Family is qualified to receive such a distribution under applicable tax law. There are specific tax advantages for those over 70 and ½ years of age who choose to make these types of charitable donations. The donation must be made directly to the qualified charity and Holy Family will acknowledge each charitable donation in writing as required by tax law. You should of course consult your tax advisor before making a federally tax-free charitable distribution from your IRA.



CARING FOR CREATION: It seems like lots of folks are doing live Christmas Trees this year. Did you know, you can make your cut Christmas tree *fire resistant* and help it to stay greener longer and stop those needles? Fill a bucket with two cups of Karo

syrup, two ounces liquid chlorine bleach, two pinches Epsom salts, one-half teaspoon Borax and one teaspoon chelated iron. Add hot water to a two gallon bucket and stir.. Ideally, after cutting off an inch or so from the bottom, soak the tree in the bucket overnight. If you must put in the stand right away, carefully monitor the water level several times a day and top off as needed, especially for the first few days and thereafter, top off daily with your mixture. If the tree stand dries out the cut end can seal itself and cease taking up water. Using this mixture will keep branches flexible throughout its time in your home. If lots of thin needles are falling to the ground it is time to move outside to be recycled by the county. With live balled and burlap trees, plain water should be used, be sure it remains moist the entire time it is in your home. (hint: dig your hole now) Turn off your lights when you are away and when you go to sleep.

**WINTER IS COMING** and it is a great time to create a emergency kit for your car. Some things to include are: a first aid kit, snow shovel, jacket and poncho, blanket, ice scraper, gloves, hat, coat and pull over rubber boots. Be sure to top off your windshield wiper fluid with a winter mix. Water and snacks are always a good idea. Jumper cables could save you or someone else in an emergency. Carefully read the instructions on the proper way to connect them or look the instructions up on the web. There are many plastic tubs in different sizes at the organize your emergency kit and to everything nice and dry. Be safe out there! Chris Gordon, OFS at christophergordon@verizon.net.


